QUIETNESS AND SAFETY:

A calendar picture portrays a beautifully serene water scene. The shore of a reservoir in northern Minnesota is lined with trees; in the middle of it is an island with a few trees. The water mirrors a blue sky laden with clouds. Believers in the Creator God who find peace in the God of all grace can look at this picture and agree with the word of the Psalmist, "He calms the storm, so that its waves are still" (Psalm 107: 29). All in whom the Spirit of God dwells by the power of the everlasting gospel have access to the peace and quiet that is so beautifully portrayed.

But reality in this sinful world reminds us that by reason of our own sin there is frequently turmoil within our heart- fear, doubt, confusion is never far from us. Furthermore, the evil and wickedness of the world in which we live oppresses us and disturbs our peace and quietness. In these last days God's people are the more agitated in heart and mind given the evil that seems to go on unabated. Yes, the quiet beauty in which we find solace and relaxation so easily is broken by a sudden wind, churning clouds, and tumultuous waters. Remember the disciples on the Sea of Galilee. The hearts of these seaworthy fishermen grew fearful so that even their faith was shaken (Mark 4: 35-41). The Lord restored calm to the raging sea, and appreciative wonder as well as peace to their troubled hearts.

We will not diminish the seriousness of the storms that intrude into our lives. The damned and damnable devil continually probes until in one way or another he causes us anguish through his lying and deceiving, or by his frontal attacks on our faith, and life itself. But we can endure! Peter walked on the churning sea. He did not do so by his own power or magic. He walked as he focused on Jesus who had bidden him to come to Him. When Peter *looked away from Jesus* and saw the waves at his feet *he began to sink*. But Christ, the ever faithful and present Help in trouble "stretched out His hand and caught him ... And when thy got into the boat, the wind ceased" (Matthew 14:22-33). Jesus not only rescued Peter. He stilled the storm. In the midst of the storms of life, our Savior is the Stiller of the storms. We can withstand the storm, we can walk, and we can stand upright through the grace and mercy of God Who in Christ loves us with an everlasting love. Thank Him with all of your heart, Who also rescues us when we lose our focus.

In good times and in times of burden our Lord is there for us, and with us. Blessed are all who believe with the Psalmist, "O Lord my God, in Thee do I put my trust" (Psalm 7:1).

Have you ever wondered in whom they trust whose god is no larger than their own imagination, and whose hope is bound to this decadent world? How blessed are all whose quiet and safety is found in Him whose blood has cleansed us from sin, and Who has promised to be with us "until we safely stand in our fatherland!"


