

The pilgrimage of Raphiel "Ray" Stifter through this world of sin and sorrow into the victorious glory of heaven may be summed up as follows: His earthly pilgrimage began when he was born on April 20, 1930, in Winsted, MN, the son of Henry A. and Florence H. Stifter. Ray became a child of God by the power of the Holy Spirit through Holy Baptism. "For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27).

Ray married Joyce Marcella Isaacson on September 25, 1954, at her parents' home in Cokato, MN. The Lord blessed their marital union with 53 years of Christian companionship and with four sons and one daughter. Ray served in the United States Navy for four years. He retired after working for 25 years in sales for Minnegasco. Those who knew him realized that he thoroughly enjoyed fishing and gardening. He also made his Christian confession before the world through his membership at Grace Lutheran Church, being a member for 49 years. Ray glorified his Lord Jesus through his life, understanding well the payment His Savior made for his sins: "For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20).

Ray's soul was summoned to be with his Lord this past Thursday evening, November 1, 2007, his time of grace here on earth being 77 years. He was surrounded by family as he peaceably fell asleep in the Lord. His earthly remains will be laid to rest at Sunset Memorial Park in St. Anthony, awaiting the Last Day of the world when our Lord will invite all of His believers: "Come, you blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34).

- (John 14:1-6) "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. (2) "In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. (3) "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. (4) "And where I go you know, and the way you know." (5) Thomas said to Him, "Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?" (6) Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.

(6) In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, (7) that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, (8) whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, (9) receiving the end of your faith; the salvation of your souls.
- (John 10:27-29) "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. (28) "And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. (29) "My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father's hand."
