OPTIMISM OF FAITH:

It is difficult to be optimistic as one sees and hears of the events and activities going on in the world in which we live. The catalogue of evil is depressing. In the cities we read of drugs, prostitution, rape, murders, mayhem, burglaries. In the nation there is crime, child abuse, spousal abuse, divorce, Hollywood and its lack of morals played out on TV screens and in the news. Abortion, lack of respect for marriage, homosexuality, political self-serving, corruption, greed are rampant. Terrorism threatens us and there is a lack of will to resist it on many fronts. Family structures are deteriorating. Education and discipline is failing, and the best answer that social do-gooders can suggest is to spend more money. More and more the government thinks it knows what is best for us from what we eat to what we should think. In the name of rights, we have forgotten responsibility. Forsaking responsibility, what is wrong is always the other person's fault. It is not new, but anti-Christian philosophies and all sort of false religions attack the truth of God. Sadly and to its great harm the church in the world is too a great extent complicit in the deterioration that is occurring through accommodation to flawed reason and political correctness instead of bowing to the divine Word. Efforts to "fix" what is broken are doomed because the Lord God -the Triune God, beside Whom there is no other - is left out of the equation!

The older among us - if the Lord is gracious - probably will not see the ultimate demise of this society which is on the course of ancient Rome. In a sense we might be ready to say, "Who cares? We can't do anything about it anyway." Furthermore we know that the world in which we live is going the way that Scripture describes as manifest in the last times. "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, without selfcontrol, fierce, despisers of those that are good, Traitors, heady, high-minded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away. For of this sort are they which creep into houses, and lead captive silly women laden with sins, led away with divers lusts ... But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience ... Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution. But evil men and seducers shall wax (grow) worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived" (2 Timothy 3: 1 - 13).

So what shall be our stance? First of all, we will **repent of our personal sins** and say, "Lord forgive us our sins." We dare not stop caring. While our time may be growing shorter, we have children and grandchildren who as God wills have their years ahead of them; they will have to live in the midst of a perverse nation and world when we are gone. Therefore we will **pray** for a change of heart in our nation, as well as for the strength needed for us and our children to endure as persecution and deception grow worse. We will **study** the Scriptures to be fortified in our faith that the Lord is still the Ruler of nations, and He is the Refuge and Strength in times of difficulty. The Lord will not ask us to bear more than He Himself will help us to bear. We will continue in the things which you [we] have learned and been assured of (2 Timothy 3: 14). If we care about our children we

will set an example for them of love of the truth and steadfast commitment to the truth of God. We will proclaim the Gospel so that we and our children will have the sure knowledge of the forgiveness of sins, and the confident assurance that where there is forgiveness of sins there is also life and salvation. We will proclaim the gospel with the prayer that those still sitting in the darkness of unbelief and hopelessness will be brought to trust in Jesus Christ. By the mercy of God we will live our life as thankful children of God so that as the Spirit works through us, others may yet be won to the kingdom of God and be snatched from the kingdom of the deceiver of the nations, the devil. By the power of the Spirit working in the Word, we will hold fast to the faithful Word. We will wait on the Lord, for judgment belongs to Him, "since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with tribulation those who trouble you, and to give you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Thessalonians 1: 6 - 8).

If the evil in the world awakens us to the passing of time, as well as the emptiness of this world and its vaporous pleasure, even it will serve the purpose of God. Perhaps that is why He permits it to flourish, that our hearts and minds might be lifted from the earth to anticipate heaven where we shall be free from all evil. Our Lord Jesus Christ has given us a future, so that while we traverse this world, we can in the face of the disaster around us still be optimistic. We are not optimistic of that which is in terminal condition. We however are blessed with the optimism of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ Who has said, "Be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). He has redeemed us, calls each of His children by name, and claims us as His own (Isaiah 43). "The name of the Lord is a strong tower, the righteous run into it and are safe" (Proverbs 18:10). That is God's promise and assurance until such time as He will deliver us from this world to that home which the Lord Jesus has won for us by His death and resurrection. We thank Him for His Spirit Who has brought us to the faith in which we can look through the present shadows to see the light of eternity.

While we despair of the future of this nation and the world in which we live, we will not despair concerning our future as children of God. We will continue in the optimism of faith- not faith in man's failed and failing efforts – but faith in the God and Father of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ- and our God!

Paul Gerhardt who knew something about tribulation wrote:

What is all this life possesses? But a hand full of sand That the heart distresses. Nobel gifts that pall(fail) me never Christ, our Lord, will accord To His saints forever. (LH 523, st.6)


