

Council Meeting Notes - July 20, 2008

The June Council meeting minutes were accepted as amended. The June treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

Board of Education Report

- A used free copier is being pursued by Phil Radichel.
- Iowa Basic test information has been given to the parents.
- Stations are being created for VBS due to classroom renovation project.

Sound/Projection Sub-Committee

- Video Equipment: Tierney Brothers quoted about \$24,000 to provide video equipment. It includes more than what is necessary. Our estimate is \$7500.
- Audio Assistance Equipment: Our estimate is \$1500.
- Sound Control Station: The location is being discussed. Our estimate is \$900.
- Pastor's Office: Replacement of furniture is being considered. Concern over the amount of floor space the layout will provide. Our estimate is \$2121.40.

Board of Trustees Report

- The classroom renovation will not be completed in time for VBS. We are waiting for a door, carpeting, and painting.
- The next church workday is scheduled for mid-August.
- Some items being pursued are a pulley for the bell rope, rain seepage on the school wall, the walkway between the back door and the shed, a lawn mower battery issue, and a service for cleaning the fellowship floor. An air conditioner was placed in the parsonage bedrooms upstairs.
