LAW AND GOSPEL: Faithful preaching consists of uncompromising teaching of the law which uncovers sin and pronounces God's judgment. It is not love to keep people in the dark concerning sin and its consequence. Faithful preaching proclaims an unconditional gospel to the smitten and penitent heart. Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. In summary as one has said, "There is no real preaching of the Christian Gospel except in the light of the fact that man is under the wrath of God."

"MAKE ME A CHRISTIAN" is the title of a television series that is airing in England. Can it be far behind in this country? The series will follow a group of 13 non-Christians who for three weeks will attempt to "live by the teaching of the Bible." (WorldNetDaily, August 10, 2008). There is no indication they will be confronted with the reality of sin. The volunteers include an atheist, a Muslim, a lesbian, and derelicts of various kinds. An Anglican, Catholic, Evangelical, and Pentecostal pastor will "mentor" them as "they attempt to live like Christians" for three weeks.

The kickoff episode has the participants go into a cathedral "where they are asked to participate in a communion service." The absurdity of this is surpassed only by its blatant blasphemy. Why even comment on it? Because it is evidence again of the betrayal of the name of Christ, and a prostitution of the identification, Christian, by which true followers of Christ are known. While this is beyond even the abuse of Christ's name so prevalent in our own country (is it?), it nevertheless is more evidence that claims of being Christian cannot necessarily be taken at face value in an age which has aptly been called the "post-Christian" age. The term Christian has been loaded with a whole lot of baggage.

The degradation of the name of Christ and the derivative description of followers of Christ increases as the world increasing enters into the church, and as the church has felt compelled to attract congregants through "fun and games." The church has trivialized its purpose. To a large extent many churches in our land have forsaken the preaching of law and gospel, sin and grace. They have become little more than social clubs with agendas set by the will and whim of the people. They have become "be-good, feel good" clubs whose message changes according to whatever will attract, as I recently heard a preacher say, "nickels and noses." As the church has shown disrespect for the Lord God by twisting and distorting His Word, it has become fertile ground for the fatal foolishness described in the news article. The anti-Christian churches that are participating in such blasphemy in England have only carried the blasphemy to the next level. We cannot help but think of the Lord's word to Judah recorded in Jeremiah 23:32 – the context is different, the judgment the same. Of the false prophets who "cause my people to err by their lies and their recklessness," the Lord said, "I did not send them; therefore they shall not profit this people at all."

The foundation of true CHRISTianity is CHRIST. Barnabas and Saul (Paul) preached Christ. Disciples were first called Christians in Antioch (Acts 11:26). It was not likely a name they took to themselves, but was a name given them by the Greeks who recognized that they were followers of Christ. Jesus Himself defines for us who a true Christian is. He said, "If you continue in My Word, then you are My disciples indeed..." (John 8: 31). A Christian is a CHRIST-BELEIVER." In the time of the Roman persecutions the name was enough to turn one into lion fodder. Today it is no less a name that enemies of Christ hate on one hand and on the other a name that false Christians have sullied.

That one who rejects the Word of God, who falsifies it with impunity, who diminishes the law of God for the sake of peace, and denies the blood atonement of Christ, who turns the Bible into nothing more than a moral code and a book of ethics, and who believes, if he believes there is a heaven at all, that he reaches it through his own righteousness may talk about Christianity as much as he pleases but he has "not the faintest conception of Christianity" (cf. Pieper, *What is Christianity*, page 23).

Christians are not made. They are born! Born by the power of the Spirit Who gathers the elect through the preaching of the gospel! Christianity is not an experiment or a TV series. Though we do not despair for we are more than conquerors through Christ who loved us (Romans 8:37), we cannot help but ask, "Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth" (Luke 18:8)? The Lord will keep faith for those who long and pray for His coming. The question is will we keep faith. Relative to the church in general, the indicators are not good!
