TRUST IN THE LORD WITH ALL THY HEART

We are approaching the end of another election cycle. Electioneering has always been a nasty and dirty exercise. We were reminded of that as we toured the Lincoln Museum a few weeks ago. The political cartoons were every bit as nasty, demeaning and savage as they are today. Nevertheless, this campaign surely has descended into the lowest pits of incivility. Further, the results of the election, depending on the point of view of different voters could well change the moral and political landscape. Our nation could become a nation that few of us recognize anymore. The undefined "change and hope" may not have much of an impact on the older generation in the short term, but those of us who care about our children and grandchildren are filled with a degree of trepidation for their future.


Politicians tell us that Americans are good people; that the better part of our nature ultimately shows forth. Let them think what they will, we know one thing for sure, and the political season brings it out- the natural heart of man is only evil continually. The lies and deceit, and the self serving that is the staple of those in government is abhorrent. The slander that dominates campaigns on either side is further evidence of the darkness of the human heart. Unfortunately it is descriptive of what lurks in every human heart, including our own. We call it sin!

The war, the economy, taxes, immigration, education, and other political and cultural issues are legitimate part of electioneering. Very little has changed over the decades. Every election we hear the same thing- grandiose promises of politicians who tell us that they will make things better. Seldom do things get better. When the ebb and flow is measured they generally are the same or worse. But yet we continue on. Why? Because "the dominion belongs to the Lord, and He rules over the nations" (Psalm 22:28). The legitimate issues will not cause a nation to rise or fall unless on one hand the Lord blesses, or on the other the Lord withdraws His blessing. Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Commend all things to Him Whose will will be done to achieve His purpose for His children.

It is not difficult to make the case that this nation is every bit as godless as Israel was before the Assyrians wasted it, or Judah before the Babylonian captivity. Political platforms and issues do not destroy a nation. Evil does! The evil that brings judgment emanates from

unbelief. Unbelief is the rejection of the Word of God. Unbelief is manifested by idolatry. It rejects the true God and His justifying love in Christ. Unbelief is a rejection of the cross and of the Savior. Unbelief lies at the root of the lack of respect for life and marriage. It is the root cause of immorality, injustice, and selfishness. As Christians who profess to believe the Word and trust in Christ, we are nevertheless tempted by reason of our flesh. To the extent that we neglect worship, are indifferent to sin, ape the ways of the world, are indifferent to the Truth, and are inconsistent in the confession of our Lord, and our faith, we contribute to the circumstances that will bring God's wrath upon a nation. Love and pursuit of that which is evil and indifference to that which is good and right is manifestation of a people that has forsaken the Triune God and Lord to Whom dominion belongs and Who rules the nations.

There is more at stake of course than the welfare of this nation. It is the welfare of our souls. Redeemed and faithful children of God will have as a first priority the welfare of their soul. They will manifest faithfulness to the Lord and His Word, and confess and trust in Christ Jesus Who delights in showing mercy. He will keep us unto eternal life. As our faith is in Jesus, all will be well with us here regardless of the circumstances that confront us in society. He cares about His children! "God, forgive us our sin and have mercy on us. Trample under foot the devil and stay the devices of all who do the devil's will. Turn the citizens of this nation to repentance and bless it as we trust in You. Lord, even as Your justice so Your promises alone are true and trustworthy. Deliver us for Jesus' sake to the perfect peace in heaven where sin, death, and the devil no longer can assail us and where is perfect peace and joy. Amen."


