

## **DECEMBER 7:**

Today is significant in the history of our nation. In 1941 the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor. The United States was at war. Pearl Harbor had not been on a state of high alert. An attack was not thought imminent. Planes were wingtip to wingtip in the airfields. Anti-aircraft guns were unmanned. Many ammunition boxes were locked reflecting peacetime regulations. No torpedo nets protected the anchored fleet. Since it was a Sunday morning, many officers and crewmen were ashore. At 7:53 AM, the first Japanese assault wave arrived. Americans were taken by surprise. The first attack wave targeted airfields and battleships. The second wave targeted other ships and facilities.

The air raid lasted until 9:45 a.m. Eight battleships were damaged, with five sunk. Three light cruisers, three destroyers and three smaller vessels were lost along with 188 aircraft. Many lives were lost. On the home front lives and families were disrupted.

As much as wars are a "necessary evil" in this corrupt world, they also reflect in many ways the inhumanity of men and nations toward one another. They who think that wars will cease on the earth are poor students of human nature, as well as of history, and the Word of God itself. December 7, 1941, as well as the recent 9/11 is reminder to us that a nation cannot take peace for granted, and that it must be on constant alert. The cry of "peace, peace" when there is no peace is the cry of people not in tune with reality. It is not pessimism but reality to acknowledge that an enemy within and without wants to destroy our society, our culture, and our nation. They who are not ready to acknowledge that and/or are only minimally interested in preparing to defend our nation may well contribute to a repeat of a surprise similar to that of December 7, 1941.

War in which nations advance hostilities against one another is just a microcosm of the war that is waged against God's people, which necessitates a state of constant alert for God's children. This war began when Satan tempted Adam and Eve. It serves no purpose to debate how Satan could have prevailed against them. The fact is that he did and he intensifies his attacks in each succeeding generation. Satan is not bashful. He carried on the war against the Messiah, the Anointed of the Father, our Savior, Jesus Christ. Jesus was manifested that He should destroy the works of the devil. Satan lost the war. He could not prevail

against God's Son. He was overcome by the Word in the wilderness (Matthew 4). The victory of our Lord was confirmed at the cross and empty tomb. God in His grace has credited this victory over sin, death and devil to our account. All who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ bask in the confidence of victory over the foe who has designed our overthrow!

Yet the devil is nothing if not persistent. Whether as an individual child of God, or the body of believers, the Church, we have been put on alert that we should not be taken by surprise. "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walks about, seeking whom he may devour: Whom resist steadfast in the faith ..." (1 Peter 5:8). The devil carries on overt war against the redeemed of God. As circumstances dictate he engages in guerilla warfare. He could not overcome the Master though he tried, so he pursues Christ believers individually and collectively. As the Church, the body of Christ, reflects the spirit of its Head, it will proclaim the Gospel of peace as commissioned by the Lord. But it will not be docile in the face of satanic attacks calculated to rob the child of God of faith, and the Church of the Word. The Church in this world must ever be the Church militant as it awaits the eternal day in which it shall be the Church victorious!

As we value the faith and our relationship with the Lord as well as our salvation, we will be alert, and ready to defend the faith against the open enemies of the Lord and His Church, as well watchful for enemies who surreptitiously infiltrate the Church militant for one purpose and one only, to rob and destroy.

The Lord has told us that as we continue in Him and in His Word no one will snatch us from His saving embrace. The message of God in Revelation is that the Church ultimately will prevail. However, let us take nothing for granted lest - as the nation was caught off guard on December 7, 1941 - we Christians are caught asleep in our faith-life by the enemy who never sleeps and is ever plotting our overthrow. Be alert. Stay in the Word! Wield the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God. Have it at the ready. Put on the whole armor of God (Ephesians 6). Be strong and of good courage! Our Lord tells us, "I will be with thee; I will not fail thee" (Joshua 1: 5, 6). And pray, "O my God, I trust in Thee, let me not be ashamed, let not my enemies triumph over me. Yea, let none that wait on Thee be ashamed" (Psalm 25: 2, 3).
