(1) Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world. (2) By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, (3) and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the *spirit* of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world. (4) You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. (5) They are of the world. Therefore they speak as of the world, and the world hears them. (6) We are of God. He who knows God hears us; he who is not of God does not hear us. By this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error. (7) Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. (8) He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. PRINCIPLE IS NOT FOR SALE!

As confessing Christians of the Lutheran faith we hold certain principles to be true and firm. As Christians of the Lutheran faith, we find fewer and fewer who are ready to stand on principle. A principle is a basic doctrine or tenet from which other principles are derived. For example, we believe, confess and hold true that the Bible is the inspired and inerrant Word of God. This is a principle among us that is not for sale! Either the Bible is God's Word in its totality or it is not. If it is, as we hold, then we cannot sacrifice it without sacrificing confidence in the Word, or sacrificing the confidence of our salvation. Our understanding of God and His person as well as of His saving will for us is predicated on holding fast the faithful Word. Unless we hold to the elementary principle that God's Word is truth we cannot be sure of creation or God's providence. We cannot understand the origin of the world and of mankind. We cannot comprehend the nature of the Law and its eternal consequence. We are left at sea with respect to God's grace and love and have no certainty of salvation. Nothing is sure about faith or life if we do not accept the whole Word of God! Without the Word, life itself is an unsolvable riddle!

Of course the heathen and the ungodly care not a wit about the principles we hold dear! But how can churches which claim the name of Christ give up the basic elementary principle that God is truth and that His Word is a perfect reflection of Him? They do this because they have bought into, and worse even sold the idea that the Bible is a wax nose, subject to be molded to the appearance or image they choose to display. Subsequently abortion, and homosexual unions masquerading as marriages, are easy to live with, if not adopt, because it is the safe and politically correct thing to do. In our melting pot of cultures we also have a melting pot of theological mush which suggests that in spite of what Scripture says, the way of salvation is to be found in whatever imagination, opinion, or whim makes people happy. They have traded the means of grace- the gospel in word and sacrament - for the latest fad and emotional appeal. They have turned the love of Christ- oh how they love Christ- into a caricature that Christ does not recognize, much less bless!

We expect in politics that principles are as firm as the next poll. Should we not be able have the confidence that they who claim to confess Christ would stand on principle and promote and defend the truth that one cannot claim to believe in Him and then twist the Word to save face in the world which in fact is interested in neither Christ nor His Word! There is a reason why judgment shall begin at the house of God!

The Lord said, "Let him that has my word, teach my word faithfully" (Jeremiah 23:28). The day - God forbid- that we trade principle for ease, safety or acceptance is the day we should cease to exist. If we are ready to offer our Scriptural principles, from the most elementary to all those derived from it, on the altar of expediency we have no right to exist. Should that happen, whatever purpose we claim to be serving, we will not be serving the Lord. The Lord is served by truth! - Rev. D. Fleischer
