CLC 50th Anniversary Book

The following is something that Pastor David Lau has written up for our congregation in a book that will be published for the CLC 50th anniversary. Please check this over and let pastor know ASAP if anything needs to be revised:



"Grace congregation was born, by the grace of God, out of concern for the preservation of God's truth." In December of 1954 the first service was held at the Hayes Elementary School on Mississippi Street. The service was conducted by Otto Abrams, a student from the Orthodox Lutheran Seminary of the Orthodox Lutheran Conference. After ordination Abrams continued to serve as pastor. The congregation was organized as Grace Lutheran Church in the summer of 1955. Grace was originally a mission congregation of the Orthodox Lutheran Conference and then became independent for a time before affiliating with the Church of the Lutheran Confession. In 1958 the congregation built a church-parsonage combination at 460 75th Avenue Northeast.

When Pastor Otto Abrams was granted a leave of absence for reasons of health, Norman Harms, a 1961 graduate of Immanuel Lutheran Seminary, was ordained and installed as supply pastor at Grace on March 24, 1963. When Pastor Abrams resigned because of ill health in September of 1963, Harms was installed as the congregation's permanent pastor on February 23, 1964. After Norman Harms received a peaceful release from his call, Professor Egbert Schaller of Eau Claire, Wisconsin, served as vacancy pastor, beginning on February 1, 1965. During the vacancy the congregation completed the second floor of the parsonage before welcoming Carl Thurow, formerly of Lamar, Colorado, as its new pastor on June 6, 1965. In the fall of 1976 Grace congregation opened a Christian Day School.

Ground was broken for a new church and fellowship building in July of 1983. On February 9, 1986, over 400 persons attended a special service in this not-yet-completed edifice when Carl Heinrich Schmutzler, formerly a pastor in the Church of Sweden, was installed as an assistant pastor. After many months of hard work this sanctuary was dedicated to the service of the Lord on June 1, 1986.

In 1963 there were 187 baptized members, including 81 pre-communicants. In 1966 the membership was down to 109 souls, with 27 pre-confirmation children. Membership kept rising after that, until the figure of 323 souls was reached in 1988. From 1976 to 1985 there were over 100 pre-communicant children in the congregation. Membership dropped to 240 souls in 2001, with 41 pre-communicants. In 2007 there were 241 baptized members, including 58 pre-communicants.

Pastors serving Grace congregation have been Otto Abrams (1954-1963), Norman Harms (1963-1965), Carl Thurow (1965-1969), Harold Duehlmeier (1970-1978), Daniel Fleischer (1978-1998), John Ude (1998-2005), and John Hein (2005-).
