CHRISTIAN EDUCATION Part 4

WHEN TO START CHRISTIAN

EDUCATION: Parents have a tendency to rush their children into school. Sometimes this is a matter of necessity because both parents work. The child is placed in a nursery, pre-school class, and then

Kindergarten. To regulate this tendency to start children in school at an ever earlier age the state sets a date by which the child must be six years old before it can be enrolled in the first grade. There are sound psychological reasons for this because a child's mental, emotional, and social development can be irreparably damaged by being placed in a structured environment in competition with other children who are more mature. You realize that we have thus far been speaking of **formal** education that we generally call schooling.

BEFORE YOUR CHILD IS BORN: But if one thinks of education as a lifelong process, then the time to begin thinking about the Christian education of your child or children is long before the first child is born. Secular educators understand full well the effects of environment upon children. One of the reasons for the bussing of children from the inner city or ghetto areas to the suburbs is to give the child an opportunity to experience a different and better environment. If illiteracy, welfarism for generation after generation, the "law of the jungle," disease and crime are the normal environment for a child from the time it becomes aware of its environment, certainly those environmental factors will have and do have a dominant influence upon the maturing of the child. How can an illiterate parent help a child with his homework? How can a parent conditioned to living on welfare inculcate a work ethic in a child? How can a child learn to know right from wrong in an amoral society and environment? From this series of negatives which are the problem many public educators it is evident how important environment is for the educating of the child.

ESTABLISH A SAVIOR-GOD ENVIRONMENT IN YOUR HOME: If you have children, what kind of a home environment have you created for your child or children? If you are anticipating

parenthood, what kind of spiritual environment are you establishing? Expectant parents may well be concerned about medical insurance to cover the expense attending upon the birth of a child. They may take special courses in pre- and postnatal care of the child. They will acquire the necessary equipment for caring for the physical needs of the child. But all this the heathen do also. What concern and what effort do Christian parents make for the creation of the proper spiritual environment atmosphere for their child?

If you haven't or don't think about this, you have already been creating an anti-spiritual environment for your child. If insurance, child-care, equipment have been your chief, and possibly only, concern, then you have failed to put first things first.

FIRST THINGS ALWAYS FIRST: The art of creating the best possible spiritual environment in your home for the Christian training of your children can be reduced to these simple four words: First things always first! Is your Savior-God like a fire extinguisher hanging on the wall — to be used only in case of an emergency? Is the Bible lying on your end table just a spiritual status symbol? Are you content with having spent a large sum of money for that symbol, but are you unwilling to feed your soul with it on a regular basis? Is the Name of your Savior-God seldom on your lips — unless something goes wrong and you feel compelled to vent your feelings by using it in vain? Is the House of your God a place to show off a new outfit on Easter Sunday rather than a place in which you refresh your spiritual life Sunday after Sunday? Is having things more important than having the eternal Truth? Is enjoying the questionable company of people of this world more pleasing than the fellowship of the saints? Is small talk so much more natural than witnessing? Is living now far more thrilling than the hope and expectation of living forever? Answer these questions honestly for yourself, and you will have the answer as to whether you are or have created an environment in your home that is conducive to the Christian training of your children.


