Council Meeting Notes: August 12, 2012

The meeting opened at 11:15 a.m. with prayer led by Pastor Hein. The minutes from the June 10 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report:

 Vice Chairman Eli Wales presented the report on behalf of Treasurer Paul Lentz.

Pastor's Report:

- VBS
 - Attended by 25 students –average attendance of 22.
 - Three non-members attended
 - The staff was great.
- Remember to keep in prayer those who are elderly and in nursing home care.
- Ann Radichel will be installed on August 26 as the kindergarten teacher for the coming school year.
- September 9 will mark the return to the regular church schedule.
- Pastor's recommendation to invite Alvin Jask to present a report of his trip to Liberia at a future bible study was discussed.
- Planning for the October 14 Mission Festival is in progress.
- Pastor will preach at Eden Prairie the Sundays of 9/23 and 10/21.
- The last few church work days have had lower attendance than in the past. Pastor urged people to think about serving the church in this manner at future church work day events. Rick Nelson observed that more would be able to attend if there was a baby sitter on hand. Discussion followed.

Elder's Report:

- The church picnic will be held Sunday 9/16 following the worship service.
 - The board recommends the picnic be held on site, but is open to suggestions.
 - A motion was passed, after a brief discussion, to have the picnic on site.
- The board recommends that the Men's Retreat be held 9/21 –
 9/23, and referred organization of the retreat to Eli.

- Eli reported nominal interest this year, and as a result will not pursue organizing an event for 2012.
- Phil suggested the matter for next year be returned to the Elders for further discussion at their next meeting.
- Harassment Policy: The Elders will meet the following Thursday review to refine the CLC draft, and will have recommendations ready for the next council meeting.
- The board is working on the calendar and budget for 2013.

Board of Education report:

- The following increases in tuition and fees for the 2013/2014 school year will be recommended to the next voters meeting for approval:
 - From \$900 per year to \$1,200 per year for grades 1-8.
 - > From \$500 per year to \$600 per year for kindergarten.
 - ➤ Book fee will be a flat \$50 for all grades.
 - > A motion was passed to approve this action.
- Heidi Nelson, Laura Wales, and Jan Davis are willing to serve as substitute teachers for the coming school year.
 - A motion was passed to issue calls to them to serve in this capacity. This will be brought to the voters meeting for approval.
- The board will be visiting the family homes of non-member students.
- There will be an ice cream social on August 20, at 7:00 p.m., at which the school year will be discussed with student families.
- Pastor noted that five students from Grace will be attending ILC this year – the largest number since Pastor has been at Grace.

Board of Trustees report:

- The board is investigating a reported problem with a water heater from which the water has an odor of sulfur.
- The board is working with routine maintenance issues.
