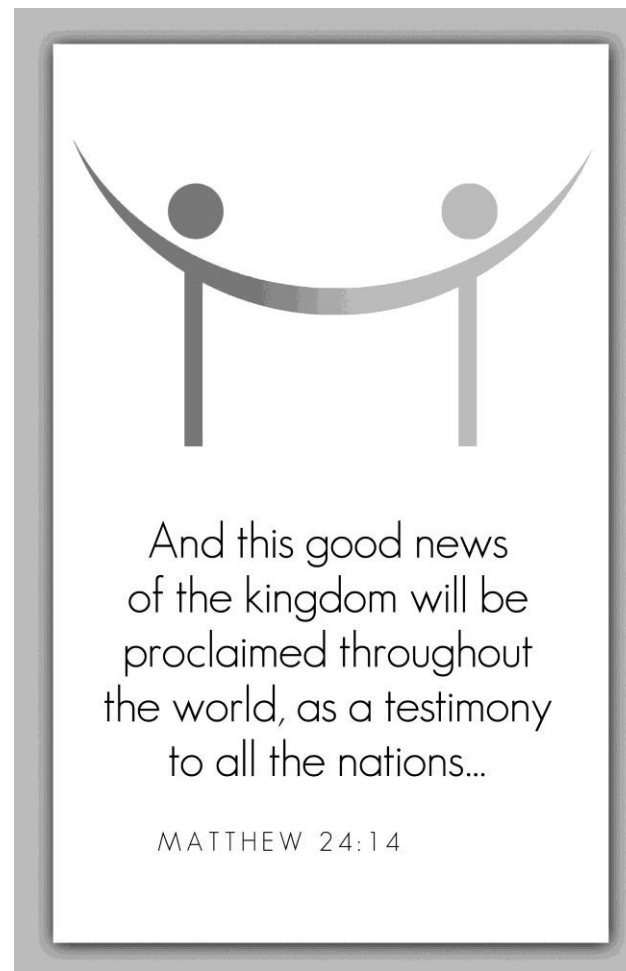

CLC Coordinating Council Devotion

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).

These are familiar words. When Jesus spoke these words He had just completed the work of salvation for lost sinners - a work which He had been appointed for from the foundation of the world. He had left His perfect abode in heaven and had come to this world of sin, taking on our flesh to become one of us, and dying on the cross as our perfect substitute before the justice of God Almighty. But Jesus had been raised from the dead and had spent the last 40 days showing Himself to His followers and teaching them about what He had accomplished for them and all people. Now He was about to leave His followers, and He entrusted them with a work of their own.

Jesus gives one simple command to His followers in this commissioning: "Make disciples!" With all the other verbs in these verses Jesus explains "how" we are to carry out this work of making disciples of all nations: By "going," "baptizing," and "teaching."

This is a daunting commission: "Make disciples of all nations!" It is no small or simple task. It had to be overwhelming when the first disciples heard it, and it is still overwhelming to the disciples of Jesus who hear these words today. But there is something astounding in the words of Jesus. With the final two participles ("baptizing" and "teaching") Jesus draws our attention to His precious gift to His Church on Earth - His Means of Grace. He does not leave us to do this work empty handed. Not at all! Our gracious Savior gives the tools necessary to carry out this all important work of making disciples. What are those tools? The Gospel in Word ("teaching them to guard all things I have commanded you") and in Sacrament ("baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit").

We have been commissioned to be a part of this joyful work. The work and the tools are His, entrusted to us and with the power to save souls lost in the darkness of sin and unbelief and headed for destruction. Our assurance in this work comes from the Lord's gifts to us (His Word and Sacrament) and in His promise to be with us while we carry out His work. He has provided all that we need, so that we can carry out our "great" commission with joy, with confidence, and with eagerness!

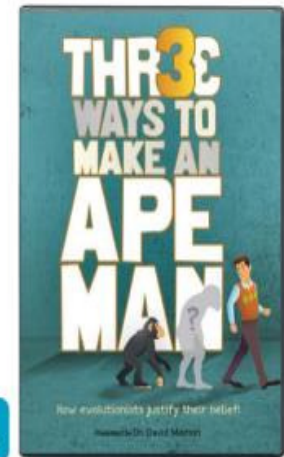

The CLC Mission Helper Program, under the direction of the CLC Mission Board, is beginning to make preparations for another Mission Trip to East Africa for the summer of 2015. The exact dates have yet to be determined, but the work was determined by our Savior when He told us to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. The main focus of this trip will be presenting the Gospel, through a series of child evangelism lessons, to member and non-member children in village congregations. Possible areas of evangelism may include the CLC-Tanzania, CLC-Kenya, CLC-Zambia, and Uganda.

Listed below are a few ways you can be involved:

Pray for this effort to share the love of Christ in Kenya and Tanzania. Ask the Lord for guidance and to show you how you can help spread the Gospel.

Begin planning, praying, and saving so you can travel to one of our foreign mission fields to help share the Good News of Christ crucified.

Offer your financial support so others may participate. There is a great need for sponsors.

There are many things you will need to prayerfully consider as you think about volunteering for this trip. What follows is a short list that could be helpful in your consideration:

- The length of the trip will be 3 to 4 weeks.
- The approximate cost is \$3000.00—\$3,500.00. This includes airfare and other expenses such as lodging, transportation, travel insurance, passports, visas etc. Vaccinations, anti-malaria meds, and other medical costs are not included in this figure.
- You must be at least 18 years of age (unless accompanied by a parent)
- You will be asked to submit an application accompanied by a letter of recommendation from your pastor.
- Deadline for Applications is January 5th, 2015.
- A \$2200 payment will be due by early February.
