

Caesar August - Martin Luther

The birth of Christ took place exactly when the Emperor Augustus sent out a decree that all the world should be taxed. This was no accident. The birth of Christ was timed to coincide with the census



because God wanted to teach us the duty of obedience even to a heathen government. Had He been born prior to the census, it might have appeared that He was unwilling to be subject to the Roman Empire. At the very first moment of His life, Christ and His parents had to give evidence of obedience, not to

God, but to the heathen emperor, the enemy of the Jews. This is the strongest proof that Christ's Kingdom is to be distinguished from that of the world. Christ did not wish to erect a kingdom like an earthly king, but wished to be subject to a heathen government. Is not this shameful, that Christ should obey a power that His people and His household regarded as an abomination? But Christ obeyed the civil government of the emperor. Every Christian, therefore, should let Augustus administer his realm—should not hinder but help.

"ACCORDING TO MY GOSPEL"

"And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them ... Then the angel said ... 'I bring you good tidings of great joy'" (Luke 2:9-10). In that announcement is the heart of the Gospel-good news! The Gospel is from God. He sent the angel. The Gospel is about God. He gave the angel the message. The Gospel is God--the Word (Gospel) become flesh (John 1:1). Jesus, the Savior, was and is the substance of the message announced by the angel to the shepherds on Christmas night.

The fullness of the gospel is Immanuel, God with us through every circumstance and condition of our life on earth. It is the message of forgiveness, redemption, and eternal salvation. The gospel is the smiling face of the Father shone to us in the face of the innocent Bethlehem babe, the face of the suffering Christ, and the radiant face of the risen Lord. Jesus is the substance without which the message is meaningless. There is no good news for the fallen world without Jesus! However, the gospel is "the power of God unto salvation for everyone who believes ..." (Romans 1:16).

In Romans 2:16, Romans 16:25, and 2 Timothy 2:8 Paul uses the expression, "according to my Gospel."? Elsewhere Paul speaks of "our gospel." He claimed the gospel as his own! He likely was using the expression "according to my gospel" as a counter to the "gospel" of false teachers, reminding his readers of the blessings derived by believing the gospel he proclaimed, as compared to the emptiness and worthlessness of the message of false teachers. But how could Paul make such a claim that his gospel was better than any other?

Paul made no claim to worthiness; nor did he usurp the gospel, or deny to the Lord the glory and honor due Him as the Author and Giver of the good news. Paul could make such a claim in view of what we read in 1 Thessalonians, "But as we have been approved by God to be *entrusted with the Gospel ...*" (2:4). He could make the claim because his was from God! Martin Luther spoke in similar vein when he said, "Not from men have I received *my Gospel* but *from heaven alone*, through my Lord Jesus Christ" (WLS, Vol. 3, para. 3767, p. 1179).

The same gospel given to Paul has been entrusted to the Church, to believers. As such, we too can before the world speak of "our gospel," as a contrast to any counterfeit gospel. To us is given the ministry of reconciliation, that is, "that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself" (2 Corinthians 5:18-19). Paul took this charge of proclaiming the Gospel seriously. He said, "For if I preach the gospel, I have nothing to boast of, for necessity is laid upon me; yes, woe is me if I do not preach the

gospel" (1 Corinthians 9:16). Furthermore he wrote, "But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than *what we have preached* to you, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:8).

As we are appointed and privileged to proclaim the Gospel (Matthew 28:19-20), we dare to say that we are God's angels in this world to bring good tidings of great joy! What a privilege and responsibility! As believers in Christ, we will have the same mind as Paul. In as much as the Gospel has been entrusted to us, it is ours to share. It is not to be hidden, abused, or misused. Bearing in mind that the gospel in its fullness is the Word made flesh, our Savior, we are to treasure the gospel committed to us and to proclaim it faithfully.

There is another aspect. As we live in the love of God and are possessors of the gospel—a privilege given only to such as believe and confess the Lord Jesus Christ—we should be offended when the ungodly and the wicked defame the gospel, or use it for their own ill-conceived purpose. In the face of such opposition we should the more vigorously preach it and by steadfast confession, as well as by renewed commitment, stand up for and with the gospel as we will want to have done "in the day when God will judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ …" (Romans 2:16).

When the Lord claimed us by His grace to be His own, He gave to us all things that are His, and issue from His gracious hand. Most notably this means the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation through the merit of our Lord Jesus Christ—the best news of all. May we without hesitation claim the gospel as our gospel and always let it be a testimony of that which He has entrusted to us! May we further take "pastor Paul's" word to Timothy to heart, "But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry" (2 Timothy 4:5).
