LIFE WHERE AND HOW LONG

A wealthy man, trying to figure out how to spend his money, according to a recent article in the St. Paul Pioneer Press. sat with some scientists who discussed, among other things, whether death is inevitable, or whether it is a "solvable problem." "A number of guests were skeptical about achieving immortality, but agreed that living to the age of 150 was a "worthy goal." Why? But then if living to be 150 in this world gone mad is a worthy goal why not 200 years?

The Creator God in His goodness created man with a marvelous intelligence. In the exercise of that God-given intelligence many advances have been made that have enhanced life on earth, including increasing man's life span. Through medical science and technology people of our generation generally live longer than generations before us. However, any expanded span of life will still be a far cry from the age of the patriarchs in the Old Testament. "All the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years; and he died" (Genesis 5:27).

In as much as death is a consequence of sin, it is folly to ask if death is inevitable. Simply put, the answer is, "Yes. Death is inevitable." Many may try to extend life to a goal of their own making, but the God who created life, and Who pronounced the judgment of death upon man because of sin, has been, is, and ever shall be the One who determines the years of an individuals life on this earth. The Psalmist whom it is unlikely would have been invited to that discussion in San Francisco wrote, "My times are in Your hand ..." (Psalm 31:15). In those words, David acknowledged the inevitability of death reasons among which are circumstances which man will never conquer— hatred and antagonism of men and nations against one another. David said, "I am a reproach among all my enemies ... They scheme to take away my life "(Psalm 31:13). Ironically the Lord said through James that the rich man will fade away in his pursuits (James 1:11). In anticipation of eternity, the child of God will pray with David, "Lord, make me to know my end, and what is the measure of my days" (Psalm 39:4).

Finally Job also acknowledged the inevitability of death, "If a man dies, shall he live again" (Job 14:14)?

Death is inevitable because of sin. Those who doubt it, look to Jesus. Death was God's judgment against man because of sin—spiritual death, temporal death, and eternal death. Jesus died and was buried because of sin—not His, but ours—which the Father laid on Him.

Man cannot extricate himself from spiritual death. He is born dead in trespasses and sins, and is rescued only from that condition by the power of the Spirit of God Who calls and enlightens the sinner through the Gospel — through the Word of the Gospel and the Gospel power inherent in baptism, the washing of regeneration. Yet temporal death remains. The body will die! Count the graves in the cemetery. But eternal death is a thing of the past for the believer in the Lord Jesus Christ. As he believes in Jesus who gave His life on the cross and restored life through His resurrection, eternal death is conquered forever. If death is simply a problem to be solved, Christ solved it. The Lord Jesus Christ "has abolished death" (2 Timothy 1:10).

So then, is death inevitable? Yes and no! Physical death, the death of the body, yes (unless the Lord returns first). Eternal death? No, for those whose Spirit-engendered life was manifest through living and dying in faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die han 11:25.26)

Lazarus died. He had been dead for 4 days. But by the miraculous exercise of God's grace, he lived. At Jesu's word he came forth from the grave. Here was a divine illustration of Jesu's words spoken for the comfort of us all, "though He may die, He shall live." That could well have been enough for us, but the Savior said even more. "And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die." "With the coming of Him in whom is the life that is the light of men, the resurrections no longer merely a far-off event at the last day; t is a presently effective reality. He who believes in Him HAS' eternal life; he ... HAS PASSED from death to life?

Why would anyone except apparently someone who has nothing better to do with his money, want to study or work at trying to make man live on this sin-cursed earth for 150 years? So one lives 150 years! He still dies! Better spent is time studying the Scriptures and learning that Jesus through His life and death has gained for mankind a life beyond what can be dreamed of or hoped for on this dying globe.

On one hand, we take issue with those who are skeptical about immortality; of course we are speaking in a different sense than they. On the other hand, we fully agree with their skepticism in the context of which they speak.

In the same verse from Timothy in which the apostle spoke of Jesus as abolishing death he says "Jesus brought life and immortality to light through the gosp When did Jesus overcome death and restore life and immortality which is assured us through the Gospel? Jesus did it when He died. Upon the completion of all that was necessary for our salvation He said It is finished." He did not die until He had fully atoned for our sin. If by His death He removed the ause of death it follows that death as a consequence of sin was also done away with. How do we know this? Jesus rose again from the dead! Death and life cannot co-exist. Either one reigns or the other. The believer in Christ knows that he haspassed from death to life. What is the evidence of having passed from death to life? Bause we love the brethren John 3:14 The "because" declares the reason why we know more have passed from death to life.

Jesus in word and deed speaks only truth. Immortality brought to light through the gospel is reality. In Christ we live to die no more as He told MarthäHe who lives and believes in Me shall never die! in the greatest of tragedies, by unbelief the majority are still under the sentence of death because they have rejected the Savior and the grace which brings salvation.

Perhaps that is the reason why they vainly seek to prolong life. To them we exhort, "Give up chasing shadows and "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved, you and your household (Acts 16:31).

As for all who believe and trust in the Lord Jesus Be faithful unto death [of the body], and I will give you the crown of life (Revelation 2:10). Hold fast what you have, that no one may take your crown (Revelation 3:11)
