Comments:

- General Fund offerings in April were \$85,573.
- The General Fund disbursements were \$64,998 leaving a balance of \$22,886.
- ILC is underspent \$46,370 year-to-date and has a balance of \$104,271.
- Congregation offerings for the ILC Academic Center were \$3,651, the monthly payment is \$7,984. A large gift of \$50,000 was received which increased the balance to \$68,692.
- MDF expenditures included \$1,950 for Appleton, WI mission, \$2,759 for church buildings and \$550 for foreign outreach actions, also received and disbursed were the mission helper travel expenses for the upcoming visit.
- The Student Aid fund balance is a negative \$8,251 with one more month of student loans to fund for the school year.
- There were no expenditures from the IIF in April.

CONFIRMATION

Two highlights in the life of a Christian young person are confirmation and graduation. They are different in their significance, but both are milestones and stepping stones in the pilgrimage of life from youth to adulthood.

In the Lutheran Church confirmation is tied to the Sacrament of Baptism. When the Lord blesses Christian parents with the gift of a child, faithful parents bring the child to baptism. Baptism is a means of grace through which by water and the Word of God, the Spirit creates faith in the heart of a child and brings the child into a relationship with Christ and the heavenly Father. Through faith the child is adopted into the family of God, and his/her name is written in the Book of Life.

Faithful parents who appreciate that their child is a gift from God will recognize that they have a responsibility to care for the child placed in their home by the Heavenly Father. They take the charge seriously to bring up the child in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, in keeping with the Lord's charge to "Let the little children come unto Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:14).

In the exercise of their responsibility they will set the child a good example of faithfulness in worship, in confession of the Savior, Jesus Christ and in Christian life. Such parents will teach the child the truths of Scripture and utilize the agencies of the church—worship services, Sunday School, Christian Day School—to assist them in fulfilling their responsibility.

After instruction in the Word and growth in understanding of the Word of God, the doctrines of Scripture, and of the blessings of the Lord inherent in the Word, the child comes before the altar of God to promise faithfulness to the Lord, and to confirm his/her baptismal vow. At baptism sponsors answered questions "signifying what God in and through baptism works in the child." "_____, do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways." In baptism the Spirit through the washing of regeneration (Titus 3:5) works the faith that confesses the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is serious child soul-neglect when parents fail to bring up their child in the faith into which he/she was baptized, or when they are indifferent, if not neglectful, to giving instruction in the Word of God to the child entrusted to them. The greatest gift that loving parents can give their child is the treasure of the Gospel through which the child is made wise unto salvation.

Whatever else is given to a child as an expression of parental love while on this earth will ultimately pass away, as will the child when God calls. But one thing is needful as Jesus told Martha concerning Mary: "... and Mary has chosen that good part which shall not be taken away from her" (Luke 10:39). One of the most poignant words of Scripture in this regard is the word of Paul who, writing to Timothy, rejoiced at the "remembrance of the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice" (2 Timothy 1:5). Mother and grandmother imparted the word to child Timothy so that Paul could say, "from *childhood* you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 3:15).

In Confirmation the child who has been instructed in Scripture gives personal witness to the faith which he/she believes. The child who has grown in the understanding of the Word of God, the meaning of baptism, and the meaning and blessing of the Lord's Supper comes before the altar to promise before God, and the Christian congregation faithfulness to the Lord. The vows of confirmation are not to be made lightly. Having confessed faith in the Triune God, and faithfulness to the divine Word, the confirmand is asked: "Do you also as a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, intend to continue steadfast in the confession of this Church, and *suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?* Finally do you *intend faithfully to conform all your life to the rule of the divine Word, to be diligent in the use of the means of grace, to walk in keeping with the Gospel of Christ, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to the Triune God, even unto death?*"

We thank the Lord for every confirmand who by the grace of God has remained true to the Lord and to the faith, and who in word and deed bears witness to their Lord. Just as surely as we thank the Lord for those, we sorrow over those who by indifference or neglect seem to have treated confirmation as a graduation from study in the Word, from active worship, as well as from steadfast confession of the faith concerning which they promised faithfulness before God. We pray that they have not lost the faith entirely, and further pray that by the grace of God they will find their way back if they have forsaken it, and also that they will learn to appreciate the fellowship of fellow believers around Word and Sacrament.

Scripture tells us that the devil never takes a a break from his goal to destroy the lambs and the flock of the Good Shepherd. Peter knew whereof he spoke when he wrote, "Be sober (self-controlled), be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about as a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Resist him steadfast in the faith..." (1 Peter 5:8-9).

It is the Lord who fits the youth for the battle against Satan, sin, and the world, and who clothes them in the garment of righteousness unto salvation. But it is the responsibility of the parents in whose home the children are placed to see that children are brought for the fitting (Ephesians 6:11-16), as it were. That fitting takes place when children are brought regularly and faithfully to sit on the lap of the Savior so that He might "touch them" (Mark 10:13). He not only fits them for battle, but clothes them in the garment of righteousness that avails before God on the day of judgment.

Oh, blest the parents who give heed
Unto their children's foremost need
And weary not of care or cost!
May none to them and heaven be lost (TLH- 625:3).

Every member of a confessional Lutheran Church regardless of age, has at one point in time made a vow before the Lord, a vow recorded in His memory bank. Whether then we are observing another's confirmation, or are being being confirmed, may we thankfully say, and with conviction of heart declare:

Blessed Savior, Who has taught me I should live to Thee alone,
All these years Thy hand hath brought me Since I first was made Thine own.
At the font my vows were spoken By my parents in the Lord;
That my vows shall be unbroken At the altar I record (TLH- 333:1).
