After speaking with the Board of Missions about this, this is to show the time commitment involved but can be something the congregation and the Board can adjust. The Board has stated that normally such trips take three weeks. something which I could arrange to where I'd miss only two Sundays (leaving on a Mon. and coming back on a Sat.).
