- ◆ Partners in Ministry Program: The 2016 CLC Convention approved the Partners in Ministry Program which is designed to link active CLC called servants who have obligations to repay ILC Student Aid Fund loans with sponsors who agree to provide matching funds for payments on those loans. The donor and recipient would remain anonymous to each other. This program is now ready for implementation. There are about a dozen eligible account holders who have been contacted directly to see if they are interested in participating and who would need to fill out an application annually. While donors may get involved with this at any time, it would be helpful to have the initial slate of donors in place by September 1 (extended deadline). - ◆ Prayers for Nepal: Heavy rainfall has led to massive flooding in hundreds of villages in Nepal. Approximately 100,000 people in 37 of Nepal's 75 districts have been affected, and at least 110 deaths have been reported. Among those affected are about 300 families from among our brothers and sisters in the HCLCN, many of whom have been displaced from their homes. The Board of Missions has authorized an initial \$5000 from the CLC Mission Development Fund (MDF) to assist our fellow Christians with recovery efforts. Please pray for the Lord's protection and provision for those who are suffering in Nepal, and pray that He provides wisdom and resources to those who are working to assist the many who are in need.
- ◆ Missionary Update: This past week, Missionary Ohlmann was in a bicycle accident and fractured the c3 vertebrae in his neck. A fracture to this vertebrae is very serious and could cause paralysis and even death. Thankfully, the Lord has preserved Todd from either of these. He will need to wear a neck brace and be under some strong movement restrictions for at least a month while they watch the fracture and make sure that it heals. He had a trip to Zambia planned this month, and that will need to be rescheduled. In addition, Missionary Evensen has safely returned to India after his furlough in the US. We thank the LORD for His care and protection of both of our Missionaries, and pray that He would grant a rapid recovery according to His will and grant them both the strength and wisdom to carry out the work of the Lord's kingdom which is before them. - * General Fund offerings in July totaled \$46,475 vs disbursements of \$86,883, beginning the fiscal year with a negative balance of -\$40,408. Congregational offerings fell short of congregational CBP estimates by \$31,000. The General Fund & Boards zero out their budgets at the end of each fiscal year by returning unused CLC subsidy (\$81,640) to the CLC Reserve Fund, to begin the new fiscal year at \$0.
- * ILC Building Projects offerings in July totaled \$1,582 vs disbursements of \$7,984, which is the monthly loan payment on the Academic Center (AC). The renovation of North Hall boys' dorm is planned to be completed by August 31 at a total cost of \$255,000, \$45,000 under budget. The balance in the Projects Fund is temporarily negative, but will become positive when the North Hall loan restores the Building Projects Fund to its pre-renovation balance of \$24,000. The Trustees retain this reserve to assure loan payments on the Academic Center. Offerings substantially above this amount are paid directly on the loan principal. The North Hall renovation loan will now be rolled into the Academic Center loan balance to maintain one monthly loan payment. North Hall renovation included removal & replacement of the old, inefficient HVAC system, re-roofing, new windows through-out, high efficiency water heaters, and some spruce-up on this 37-year-old building.
- MDF: offerings in July totaled \$7,452 vs disbursements of \$4,745.
- * SAF: received \$8,717 in July from offerings (\$2,584) and student loans repaid (\$6,132) vs disbursements of \$11,067, which was from Family Multi-student grants allocated to student accounts for the 2nd semester and other expenses. The SAF balance of \$66,567 is a good start toward the SAF budget for the next school year of \$160,000, to provide student loans, grants, & scholarships. Funding depends on congregational offerings, repayment of SAF student loans. & Endowment investment income.

Atlanta Update

From Pastor Frank Gantt ... A little over a month ago, Zion Lutheran Church of the Atlanta area was, by the blessing of God and through a loan from the CEF, able to purchase property that will soon become the permanent location, God willing, of Zion.

The property sits on the far eastern side of the Atlanta metro area, just south of the town of Loganville. On the almost 17 acre property there is a house, sanctuary, and garage that has been converted into a chapel. The property itself is beautiful, though a bit overgrown. The sanctuary is a block building horse barn that has been converted into a sanctuary. There is some renovating that needs to be accomplished before we are able to use it, and with the Lord's blessing, we will be accomplishing that work after the sell of the previous parsonage. In the meantime, the house on the property has a sizeable room that will serve as our temporary sanctuary. ...

We are thankful to God not only for this new opportunity to be faithful witnesses to the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, but also for the generosity of the members of the CLC who have helped to support us for many years, as well as for the guidance of our Mission Board and the Board of Trustees who approved the loan request from the CLC. Please offer prayers of thanksgiving with us and ask that the Lord will bless our witness according to His gracious will and purpose.

Project KINSHIP Update Summer 2017

God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them. Hebrews 6:10 (NIV)

For thirty years, the Lord of the Church has opened many doors and exposed hundreds of opportunities where our church body has been able to improve the quality of life for many in our foreign fields. KINSHIP is the means by which the CLC supports orphans, widows, and students, and provides disaster aid for our foreign fields. Your prayers, sponsorships, and support are requested.

NIGERIA:

The Nigerian government has temporarily closed the NCLC Children's Home due to building code violations. Without repairs, the government could permanently close the orphanage and move ten orphans to other orphanages. Some repairs have been completed; an additional \$2,000 of KINSHIP general funds was

approved to finish the necessary repairs. It is our prayer that the Children's Home can be quickly reopened.

BELC/CLCI:

Two more sponsors are needed for BELC students as the class size will be increasing from twenty-three to twenty-five students. Likewise, the incoming class at the CLCI seminary will increase from fifteen to seventeen in June. What a blessing that these two schools have been turning out scores of trained gospel workers in India through the BELC and CLCI.

GIFTS:

KINSHIP continues to provide modest monetary Christmas gifts to each of the orphans, young students, and teachers under our care. Several schools and organizations have sent Christmas cards and gifts; the KINSHIP Committee thanks them for their zeal and kindness. Recently, \$500 was distributed to children in Liberia during a recent mission visitation to that country. Monetary graduation gifts continue to be presented to those who have completed their training at our supported Bible colleges and seminaries. Recently KINSHIP sent \$50 per graduate of the BELC and the CLCI seminary at Nidubrolu. These gifts help the graduates as they begin their lives as trained ambassadors for Christ.

DISASTER RELIEF:

In December, a cyclone caused major destruction and loss of property among our brethren in India. The Board of Missions sent \$6,000 of KINSHIP funds to India to quickly provide disaster aid for this need. CLC members can participate in disaster relief with offerings to the KINSHIP general fund.

Togo:

Pastor Kossi of the EELC has been very active in Lome' and Valparaiso. Conditional upon KINSHIP support, he is in the process of securing governmental approval for a home orphanage. For this reason, KINSHIP is seeking new sponsors for six orphans; their sponsorship is \$25 per month. Simultaneously, Pastor Kossi is providing assistance for thirty-nine children whose fathers have died, leaving their families with little or no family financial support. These children enjoy a weekly Bible study with Pastor Kossi along with assistance for school uniforms, fees, and a daily meal. KINSHIP has approved \$1,500 a year to help Pastor Kossi with this endeavor. In addition, Pastor Kossi has registered the Mt. Horeb Lutheran Bible Institute with the government and has six students ready to begin classes. KINSHIP is seeking sponsors for these students beginning in July; the cost would be \$30 per month, per student, with a two-year program of studies envisioned.

Congo:

Over the past year, Pastor Yumba has been working zealously to open and operate a seminary in Lubumbashi. In anticipation that this new seminary will begin this year, KINSHIP has been asked to seek sponsors for ten seminary students at a cost of \$40 per month, per student, with a two-year program envisioned.

OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGE:

The Lord of the Church has challenged us with opportunities to share the love of the Savior with children and students within our foreign mission fields. Thirty (30) new sponsorships are needed for either young men training to be the Lord's gospel ambassadors or for orphans sitting at the feet of Jesus. **Never before has KINSHIP asked for so many new sponsors.** If you have ever considered participating in the sponsorship program, please give this request some thoughtful prayer. Sponsorships range from \$25 to \$50 per month. Sharing this responsibility with a family member or friend is also an option. The Lord promises His delight and gracious reward...what joy there is in serving in the Lord's Kingdom, to the glory of His name, always bearing in mind that "pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is to visit orphans and widows in their trouble ..." (James 1:27)
