The whole life of the Christian thus becomes a daily repentance. The more sincerely Christians daily endeavor to rid themselves of all they have and to serve God alone in all their works, the better they learn to know the abysmal sinful depravity which clings to them, and the more earnestly they will daily implore the free grace of God in Christ. And since they are no more under the Law, but under grace (Rom. 6:14), they daily begin anew their struggle to attain perfect sanctification, deploring their many failures ("O wretched man that I am! Who shall deliver me from the body of this death?"), but, at the same time, being assured of their ultimate victory ("I thank God through Jesus Christ, our Lord," Rom. 7:24-25). Striving after perfect sanctification, the Christian thus leads a life of daily repentance. Francis Pieper, Christian Dogmatics, V. 3, p. 34.

Notes

- General Fund offerings in October totaled \$76,299 vs disbursements of \$72,519, a positive cash flow which reduced the General Fund deficit by \$3,800 in October. General Fund offerings needed per month are \$77,500.
- * ILC Building Projects offerings in October totaled \$5,565 vs disbursements of \$75,218, of which \$8,000 was for the monthly loan payment on the Academic Center and the balance for final renovation expenses for North Hall boys' dorm. The dorm renovation is complete at a total cost of \$253,714, \$47,000 under budget. The November financial report will reflect reimbursements to the Projects Fund from the Convention-approved CEF loan, which will restore the Building Fund to its pre-renovation balance of around \$24,000. The new loan principal for the consolidated AC loan balance & the North Hall renovation is \$1,460,931. Monthly payments of \$8,000 begin in November @4% APR for 283 payments. Offerings that are substantially above the \$24,000 Building Fund reserve are paid directly on the loan principal, saving interest & decreasing the loan term.
- * CEF: revenues in October totaled \$139,362, which included a \$100,000 balloon payment from Zion Ev of Atlanta (Loganville), GA on their CEF loan with proceeds from the sale of their old parsonage. Three congregations have paid off their mortgages so far this calendar year.
- MDF: offerings in October totaled \$12,432 vs disbursements of \$3,301.
- * SAF: received \$14,546 in October from offerings (\$4,480) and student loan re-payments (\$10,066) vs disbursements of \$12,078, mainly for the monthly allocation for student awards & loans. The annual SAF budget is \$160,000 and provides student loans, grants, & scholarships. It is funded by congregational offerings, student loan repayments, and some Endowment earnings.

Our student teacher will be Michaela Winters, married to Kenny Winters and daughter of Steve and Eve Naumann. Michaela will be here from January 2nd until mid-March. We pray that



her experience here will be rewarding for her and for our students. If anyone would be willing to provide housing, please speak with Janelle Hein. It is believed that our last student teacher was Bethany Tiefel (now Gurgel), back in the mid-1990's. So we are grateful for this opportunity to serve our church body in our united goal to prepare pastors and teachers for the ministry.
