

✠ Letter Read Last Sunday to Grace ✠

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ at Grace Lutheran Church,



It is indeed a reflective and vigorous process to consider a call from our Lord Jesus Christ to serve as pastor to any faithful group of Christians. Having reviewed the information regarding the call to Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Spokane and having prayed to our Lord for guidance in my considerations, the Holy Spirit has led me to return the call to serve as Pastor at Trinity

and to remain in Fridley as Grace's called Pastor. I am confident that this is the Lord's will at this time, as I hope you are as well.

This decision was not an easy one as I considered the needs at Trinity and the needs at Grace. Having come from the state of Washington, I can relate to being on the outskirts of much of our CLC activity and how this impacts the needs there. In speaking with various members of Trinity, many of them gave me some very valid reasons to weigh carefully and to take to the Lord in prayer. One well-respected elderly member there even dared me to come and take on the challenging task of Trinity's ministry, a comment that greatly intrigued me as the competitive nature in me likes to face challenges. But in speaking with various members of Grace, it is obvious that my work here at Grace is not done. In fact, I must admit I greatly appreciated the love and support that many of you extended to me during the deliberations. I was very impressed with some of the thoughtful and profound comments many of you shared which made it clear that the gifts the Lord has given me fit well for the pastoral needs here at Grace. I also must acknowledge that the timing of this call just did not match the various circumstances necessary in my current life and ministry to make acceptance of this call possible. The Lord certainly uses the call process to heighten a profound awareness of the current state of matters within the congregation and what challenges the congregation has that need the pastor's attention and care. Thank you all for helping me with that. While the call process can be demanding, it is also inspiring as it reveals what great things the Lord can and will still do through the proclamation of His Word.

Trinity in Spokane will always be a very dear congregation to me. I hope you will join me in the prayer that the Holy Spirit will lead a faithful and diligent shepherd to serve Trinity. Meanwhile, I am eager and excited for how the Lord will continue to bless the ministry of the Word here at Grace. May the Lord richly bless all of us as we work with His Word of Truth. "Your word, O Lord, is eternal; it stands firm in the heavens" (Psalm 119:89).


CLC E-Devotion – November 14, 2017

THE LAST DAY WILL BY OUR HAPPIEST DAY

It's a custom in the Lutheran Church, as the church year winds down to its close, to direct our thoughts to the topic of the End Times, to the Second Coming of Christ, and to the life of glory that awaits us in heaven.

The Bible has much to say to us on this subject for our spiritual encouragement. One of things it teaches is that, when Jesus appears on earth on the Last Day He will put His unsurpassed glory as the eternal Son of God on full display for all to behold. His coming then will be altogether different from His coming to earth the first time. When He came to earth two thousand years ago He came in quietness and gentleness. He was born lowly in a stable. He lived the life of a poor servant and died the shameful death of the cross that He might save us.



When He returns to earth on the Last Day He will come with the fullness of His divine majesty and holiness shining forth brilliantly from one end of the earth to the other. He'll be flanked by an angel-army comprised of thousands. Nor will it be a quiet event. "For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air" (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17).

General Fund – Offerings in October totaled \$81,933 vs disbursements of \$79,590, reducing the deficit by \$2,400. Average monthly offerings needed are \$81,600. The General Fund subsidizes the budgets of the CLC Boards of Trustees, ILC Regents, Missions, and Ed & Publications. It is supported by congregational offerings to the CLC Cooperative Budget Plan (CBP)

ILC Operations – October ILC revenue was \$113,315 vs disbursements of \$113,311.

ILC Building Projects – October congregational offerings were \$3,840 vs disbursements of \$8,000. The fund needs regular offerings of \$8,000/mo to cover the monthly loan payment.

CEF – October revenue was \$31,500 from congregational loan payments, while disbursements of \$55,393 was mostly for a \$50,000 promissory note matured & paid to a member loan to the CEF.

MDF – October offerings totaled \$14,866 vs disbursements of \$24,024 for foreign mission fields, which included \$9,725 for a 5-day West Africa Pastor Conference & travel (40 from Nigeria, Togo, Benin, Ghana, Liberia), \$7,100 for Tanzania seminary start-up costs, \$5,000 for Nepal vehicle purchase & \$2,300 for Outreach in Mexico & Myanmar.

SAF – October revenue of \$12,680 included congregational offerings (\$5,980) and student loan re-payments (\$6,700) vs disbursements of \$12,005, for Student Grants, Loans, & Scholarships.

Kinship – October cong & sponsor offerings of \$3,513 vs disbursements of \$3,373, for Tanzania pastor medical (\$2,000), Myanmar Flood Relief (\$713) and Orphan/Sem/Widow support (\$360)
