"Who doesn't know the Lord's Prayer by heart?" Most people, even non-Christians, know the Lord's Prayer, or

parts of it, by memory. The familiar words of this prayer can easily come to mind for most people. But that familiarity is a double-edged sword. If you're anything like me, you may have the unfortunate habit of skimming over this prayer as you say it. The words come easily, but the meaning gets left behind. I encourage you to try slowing down and meditating upon each phrase of the prayer to better focus on the meaning of these wonderful words of our Savior. It will help with not only your understanding of the prayer, but also how it can be applied in your faith life.

Of course, this is exactly what Martin Luther did as he was compiling the Small Catechism. Each part of the Lord's Prayer was put into seven sections called "Petitions". For the purpose of this article, I'd like to apply each piece of this prayer to evangelism.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name

The substance of your outreach should be rooted in our Heavenly Father, and in Him alone

Your kingdom come

The action item of an advertisement is sometimes named the CTA, or Call to Action. When you evangelize, what is your CTA? What is your purpose? It should be the expansion of the Kingdom of God, the one that has been established in each believer's heart.

Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven

Evangelism can go hand-in-hand with skepticism: Will anyone listen?, Will anyone care?, Will they laugh at me? Excuses abound: We don't have enough money in our budget, I'm not a good public speaker, I'm too busy. Instead of worrying about the success of your outreach or your own abilities, put everything in God's hands. Simply preach the Word and say "Your will be done".

Give us today our daily bread

This is similar to "Your will be done." It's too easy to worry about the "stuff" of evangelism: money, resources, time, volunteers, personal abilities. But as we have learned from the Word time and time again, so we believe: God will provide.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us

God's love for us was no more clearly shown than when He sent Jesus to die for our sins. Through that sacrifice we are forgiven for every single sin we commit. While it is important to include the law in our outreach messaging, it is even more important to deliver the good news of the forgiveness of the sins of the world. We don't need fancy words or logic to convince people. We simply need the message of Christ and what His sacrifice means to us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil

As with every other aspect of our life, temptations will arise in our evangelism efforts. You may get obvious temptations to quit evangelizing. But more likely, subtle temptations will arise to become complacent or to divert the focus of your outreach to the quality of your speech, to the beauty of your church facility, or to the size of your congregation.

As we have heard elsewhere in this prayer, focus on the Word of God alone. His will is behind your message. We also know that everyone's days are numbered, while there are many who have not yet heard of our Savior. We should not ignore the Divine call to spread the Gospel.

The Lord's Prayer is short and easy to remember. But don't let that simplicity fool you. These words from Christ are powerful and not to be overlooked. They can apply to every aspect of your life, including outreach, and should be a frequent consideration in your devotions at home or your daily interactions with others.
