- → Midweek Advent Worship: This coming Wednesday, 7 pm, begins our Midweek Advent worship services. These will be held for the next three Wednesdays with our last one on Dec. 16 being our annual candlelight service. Due to restrictions, we will be unable to have our congregational Christmas meal this year.
- ➡ Christmas Eve Worship: This will be on Thu., Dec. 24, 6 pm. The children at Grace will be presenting the theme "God's Love Eternal," considering how His love planned the birth of Jesus, the Savior to save the world from eternal punishment, offering forgiveness of sins and eternal life. Join us during this precious time of year to ponder our Savior's coming. This year adjustments are being made in accordance with COVID protocols. To accommodate proper distancing within sanctuary and to keep our occupancy under 100, online registration is required: signup.com/go/jAJfTHA. A seating chart will then be created. Also, the children rehearsals will be on Nov. 29, Dec. 6, and 13 following the worship service for about an hour, perhaps the final one being a little longer. We will still have the final rehearsal on the Sunday morning prior, on Dec. 20 at 8:45 am.
- → Christmas Day Worship: This will be on Fri., Dec. 25, 10 am. Christ's birth is the reason for the season. May the love of this Child be the gift you open up your heart to on Christmas Day!
- **→ Catechism Break:** We will be having a two-week break for midweek Catechism students on Dec. 23 and 30.

- New Tour Choir CD: A new ILC Tour Choir CD has been released. A poster is by the mailboxes. Cost: \$12/each or \$20 for two. Pastor has copies available on consignment.
- **→ 2021 Cleaning:** The 2021 cleaning sign-up list is now posted on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall. Please consider signing up.
- **Parking Reminder:** For those members who are able, please park further away to permit those with physical impairments to be able to park closer to the church.
- **▶ Large Print Hymnals:** As a reminder, there are three copies of The Lutheran Hymnal in large print. These are by the guest book. Feel free to use these and return at the end of the worship service.
- **Sunday School Teachers:** Perhaps something to consider this Christmas is extending our Sunday School teachers an expression of gratitude for what they do for our children each week.
- **From the Elders:** All loose offerings collected during December will be distributed equally among the congregation's called workers.
- **▶ Liberia:** To make a contribution to the work in Liberia, write in "Liberia" on one of the Project lines of your offering envelope.
- → **Organ:** A key current project that the Voters determined to have as a goal is the replacement of the organ. There is a fund open for that purpose. You may designate donations as "Organ Fund."
- ➡ Stock Donations: In the October meeting the Voters of Grace resolved to provide a process for members to donate equities to the Congregation. The process has now been set up and anyone interested can get information on how to proceed from President Rick Nelson or Secretary Bill Rust. Such a donation spares the donor from being taxed on any capital gains.
- → Qualified Charitable Distribution: For those over 70½ it may be beneficial for you to send your offerings directly from an IRA fund to the church. Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending



Our Confessional Position as a church is becoming more and more unique and more and more isolated from that with which most people are acquainted. It is unique. Not because it is different from the revealed Word of God, but just because it is drawn from the Word. It is an isolated position because more and more are forsaking the olds paths of sound doctrine. We sometimes get the reputation of being negative because we are "against everything." overstatement is just that, an overstatement. Yet a certain element of truth is found in the "against," because what we are "against" emphasizes the positive, what we are "for." We are against the evil that destroys the soul; against compromise that robs of the Gospel: against anything and everything that diminishes the glory of God. We maintain among us that the Bible is that which the Lord says it is, namely His inspired and inerrant Word. All of it! One cannot make that confession without being against the contrary teaching that says only part (and possibly none) of the Bible is God's Word, or that at very least it is subject to human interpretation. Why are we against diminishing the Word? As a child may say, "Because God said so." But our respect for the Word is deeper than that. The Word itself is that which has worked the conviction of faith in our heart, faith in the Lord Jesus Christ our Savior. As we come into the season of Advent, move on to Christmas, meditate in Lent, and rejoice at Easter we do so in the confidence that the birth of our Lord, the suffering of our Lord, and the resurrection of our Lord from the dead glorifies our Heavenly Father, and is the life and the breath of our existence here, as well as the foundation of our confident hope of heaven. We are either for that or against that confession of faith. We cannot be both. Jesus said, "He who is not with Me is against Me" (Matt. 12:30). We are therefore "against" because we are "for." We cannot be "for" without being "against" because such a balancing act that cannot be sure on which side of the fence it stands is a denial of Christ.
