

<u>Voters Meeting Notes – September 12, 2021</u>

- Meeting opened with prayer.
- Motion passed to accept Kevin Hulke as a voting member.
- Motion passed to have Ryan Oman serve Sunday School superintendent.

Organ Committee

- Looked at electronic and pipe organs and consulted with other CLC congregations. 5 other CLC congregations currently use and are happy with their Phoenix organ. Secured the use of a demo Phoenix organ.
- Had the option to purchase the demo organ. Passing on that option since it is used and has some wear and tear. Additionally, the committee wanted to give the Fond du Lac congregation the option to purchase the organ since they were interested in it.
- The purchase price estimate is \$55,000. This would cover the organ and the required sanctuary modifications to complete the install.
- 60% of the funds are needed to place the order.
- Estimated delivery is 6-12 months after placing the order.
 - The Organ Committee is recommending the purchase of a Phoenix PDL240 organ with a \$55,000 target fund and a requirement of having 60% of the those funds prior to ordering; support; some discussion followed; approved by unanimous vote.
- The Sanctuary Improvement Committee has a congregational meeting scheduled for after church on Sunday, September 26th.

Council Meeting Notes – September 12, 2021

Meeting opened with prayer. July Council meeting minutes read and approved. Treasurer's report was reviewed and approved. Offerings received were \$2,400 less than average. The interest from the 2 CLC loans was received. The organ fund is receiving regular contributions.

Pastor's Report

- Transfer paperwork for Ed and Verona Lentz completed.
- Catechism students this year: Public School: L. Boe; Grace School: N. Story, M. Rinne, S. Konway, U. Wales, C. Nelson, R. Oman, and D. Rinne
- Sunday school staff is in place. Teachers are: Julianna Hein (Pre-K thru K), Mikey Oman (1st-4th grades), and Laura Wales (5th-8th grades).
- A preliminary 2022 church calendar was presented.

Board of Elders Report

- Offering plates will now be passed through the pews.
- With communion returning to the pre-Covid distribution method in October, the common cup will again be used.

Board of Education Report

- It is suggested that a collection be taken for a gift for the student teacher. Pastor will place an announcement in the bulletin.
- Tuition aid fund balance is ~\$2500. Per procedure, equal amounts will be sent to ILC in early Oct. for each of Grace's students (2 this year).
- More calls are coming in from non-member families interested in sending their children to Grace. Currently the school has 28 students (13 member, 15 non-member). Roughly \$30,000 in non-member tuition is being received. Discussions on how to accommodate a larger enrollment and what the maximum capacity would be. A non-member tuition increase is being considered for next year. The Board of Ed plans on bringing a recommendation to the Council.

Board of Trustees Report

- Two new school doors are on order. Total cost for the doors and installation is ~\$9000.
- Installing a liner is being considered to lengthen the life expectancy of the sewer line. Estimate is ~\$6700 and would be paid for out of the Trustees budget.

Other Business

- Phil mentioned that budget planning spreadsheets have been sent to the boards. A salary increase should be considered for the called workers since one wasn't given last year.
- Next month's council meeting is scheduled for the first Sunday of the month (Mission Festival is on the 2nd Sunday).
