Now it came to pass, about eight days after these sayings, that He took Peter, John, and James and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ As He prayed, the appearance of His face was altered, and His robe *became* white *and* glistening. ³⁰ And behold, two men talked with Him, who were Moses and Elijah, ³¹ who appeared in glory and spoke of His decease which He was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³² But Peter and those with him were heavy with sleep; and when they were fully awake, they saw His glory and the two men who stood with Him. ³³ Then it happened, as they were parting from Him, *that* Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; and let us make three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" -- not knowing what he said. ³⁴ While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were fearful as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is My beloved Son. Hear Him!" ³⁶ When the voice had ceased, Jesus was found alone. But they kept quiet, and told no one in those days any of the things they had seen. (*NKJV*TM)

CLC E-Devotion – January 28, 2008

Matthew 17:1 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves.

A MOUNTAIN TOP LESSON

Transfiguration Sunday is approaching, the day we remember how Jesus manifested His heavenly glory to three disciples on a mountain of northern Galilee. What a remarkable experience it must have been! To see Jesus (even if only for a brief instant) in the fullness of His glory (as we shall one day see Him)!



As they began their trek up the mountain, I'm sure they weren't expecting anything spectacular to occur. They had no reason to believe their time with Jesus apart from the throngs would be different than on previous occasions. "We'll have a chance to rest. We'll have opportunity to ask our Master questions and receive instruction about God's kingdom truths."

Not many days before, He had shared with them words hard to comprehend. He floored them with the announcement: "I'm going to Jerusalem to suffer at the hands of the elders, priests, and scribes. I'll be killed and on the third day rise." What did He mean? Why did He speak of suffering on a cross? They needed enlightenment. And what a course of instruction they received!

As they stood with Him on the mountain, His face began to shine like the sun. His clothes became bright as a lightning flash. Two prophets, Moses and Elijah, appeared and conversed with Him. A cloud enveloped them from which came a voice: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!" Then, just as quickly as the experience began, it ended. They found themselves alone with Jesus, looking the way He always had, like an ordinary man.

The lessons the Lord wished His disciples then, and us today, to draw from this extraordinary happening? He used this event as a visual aid to reassure our hearts and help us see that He truly is God's Son about whom the prophets wrote, whom the Father chose from eternity to save us by becoming our Servant. In His state of humiliation He looked like no one special. He would suffer and die a shameful death. But this was the very method by which He would obliterate the sin-barrier separating sinners from their holy God and enable them to live in His presence.

Meeting opened with prayer. January Council meeting minutes read and approved. January Treasurer's report was reviewed and approved.

Pastor's Report

- Per his request, motion approved to transfer Scott Baker to Gift of God Lutheran Church in Mapleton, ND.
- Pastor reached out to Brian and Maureen Eichstadt. Motion approved to recommend to the Voters to honor Briand and Maureen Eichstadt's request to be removed from membership.
- Joshua Stifter has moved to Atlanta, GA, and is not interested in transfer. Motion approved to recommend to the Voters to honor Joshua Stifter's request to be removed from membership, including Maximus and Raphael under parental care.
- A pulpit rotation is in place for Lenten services. Participants are Grace (Pastor Hein), Berea (Pastor Pfeiffer), Pastor Dave Shierenbeck and Pastor Dan Fleischer.
- Dan Kelley will be starting adult instruction with Pastor.

Board of Elders Report

- Soup suppers will be monitored for attendance and number of volunteers to see if any changes are needed.
- Phil mentioned that Grace should consider streaming church services.

Board of Education Report

- Student Fair this year will be on Friday, April 8. The focus will be on artists.
- Iowa Basic tests will be administered the last week of April.
- School was canceled for 1 week in January because some of the students tested positive for Covid.
- A meeting to discuss increasing enrollment will be held soon. Participants will be the teachers, Pastor, and the members of the Board of Education.
- Application is in hand for the Spring Lake Park Tower Day parade on June 9.

Board of Trustees Report

- The 2 lower grade classroom light fixtures have been converted to LED. Fixtures in hall are the last ones that need to be converted.
- Some new carpet is needed in the parsonage.
- The parsonage oven was fixed with Bob Vandeveer's help.

Other Business

- Purchase agreement for new organ signed and down payment made. May 1st would be earliest organ would arrive. Some final decisions on organ features are being made. Ryan Mueller is being consulted on these. Plans are to install new organ where current organ is. Some modifications may be needed as well as new flooring in that area. Speaker wires need to be routed from the organ to behind altar. Could be done indoor, outdoor, or possibly via Bluetooth connection. Plan is to order decorative side panels for the organ although these would cost extra. Some discussion on routing wires by boring under church. Some discussion on paying for extra features (e.g. decorative side panels) that may exceed the originally approved budget.
- The Chairman thanks the outgoing council members for their service and also thanks the new members for their willingness to serve.
