Welcome to our service this morning. Today we will be reviewing the lessons from this week's Vacation Bible School. Our children learned about the life of Joseph. From his life we learn that God has an ultimate plan for all His people. We, as Christians, can have confidence that no matter how difficult things might seem to get during life, ultimately everything works out for our good. Because the Lord has given us the forgiveness of sins in Jesus Christ's sacrificial death on the cross, it is the Lord's will that we rely upon and trust in His grace during all tribulations. This is why we are undertaking the theme this morning taken from the Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "Your Will Be Done." You will notice that there is a fitting connection between the lessons from Joseph and the various petitions of the Lord's Prayer, giving us all an opportunity to publicly confess what we learned about these in Luther's Small Catechism. Our children will be participating throughout the service. May your worship be blessed and may His will be done!

## "Your Will Be Done"

C: In the name of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen. We thank You, our heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept all harm and danger away from us last night; and we pray that You would also protect us today from sin and every evil, that our lives and all our behavior may please You. Into Your hand we entrust our bodies and souls and everything else. Let Your holy angel be with us, that the devil may have no power over us. Amen.

Never do I want to consider my life, honor, goods, and whatever I have as higher and greater than Thy will. Thy will shall please me at all times throughout my life.

My Jesus, as Thou wilt; Oh, may Thy will be mine!
Into Thy hand of love I would my all resign.
Through sorrow or through joy Conduct me as Thine own
And help me still to say: My Lord, Thy will be done.

## Follow-up from the 2022 CLC Convention:

From CLC President Michael Eichstadt in a letter sent this past week:

**WELS/ELS:** This summer's CLC Convention resolved the following:

RESOLVED that the CLC president, in conjunction with the Joint Committee and the Board of Doctrine, bring the three points outlined on page 30 of the Prospectus to the WELS and ELS to see if they are willing to accept them.

- 1. All three church bodies must clearly state their agreement on what Scripture teaches in Romans 16:17-18 concerning the termination of fellowship with false teachers.
- 2. It is necessary that the WELS and ELS reject past official, synodical statements on this subject which disagree with the doctrine of Scripture.
- 3. It is necessary that current official synodical statements that conflict with the doctrine of Scripture are removed or corrected, not merely annotated in online format. (Prospectus, p. 30)

I forwarded the resolution to President Obenberger of the ELS and to President Schroeder of the WELS, along with a note expressing my hope that they would be willing to meet with us at least one more time to discuss the three points. In part, their response reads:

"The conventions of both the ELS and WELS have already agreed to that provision of the Joint Statement.

Having said all that, we believe that the CLC, in the resolution passed by its convention, has erected an insurmountable barrier to further talks. This is truly a sad day, because we had sincerely hoped that the Joint Statement would be the first step towards re-establishing fellowship based on our synods' agreement in biblical doctrine. We believe that the Joint Statement, crafted carefully and in good faith, showed that there really is no doctrinal difference on this specific question. And with the stipulations of the three points, along with a lack of specific examples of ambiguity in the Joint Statement and specific examples of doctrinal statements and synodical resolutions that would need to be changed, it seems that further talks cannot take place. It's not because we are unwilling to talk, but because we are unable to meet the conditions set before us."

## **Our Quilted Banners**

A pair of quilted banners now hangs in our sanctuary. While the artistry may be immediately apparent to the viewer, a deeper value comes from understanding the symbols that bring to mind the Bible history accounts that inspired each block.

The two banners are divided into Old Testament and New Testament themes. The Old Testament banner begins in the upper left corner with "In the Garden." Fabrics were specially selected to show leaves and

flower buds in the fresh creation of Eden.

Directly to the right of "In the Garden" is "Tree of Life." While Gen. 3 reminds us that mankind's sin barred us from partaking of this tree, Rev. 22 promises that those who are washed in Christ's righteousness will have the right to eat from it and live forever.

The second row shows a representation of "Noah's Ark." If you look closely at the sky above the ark, you can see a hint of the rainbow of promise. To the right of that is a more abstract "Jacob's Ladder." The repeating pattern of the block colors guides the eye upward.

The next row begins with "David and Goliath." Its story is more beautifully told through its construction. The center blocks are made first, looking like crossed spears,



but in the end, Goliath's spears came to nothing and the corner pieces look like trees that have been toppled in the mighty name of the Lord.

Across from "David and Goliath" is the "Fiery Furnace." The four identical quadrants pivot around a central point. Although three men were sent into the flames, a fourth, the Angel of the Lord, was with them - Christ himself, who is the center of our meditation.

The final row shows the "Shepherd." The center is the Good Shepherd himself. Look for his staff in dark blue. There are 5 sheep hidden in the

block. Four are at his back, safe in the fold, and one is at his feet, recently found. There is a hint of a rainbow in the upper corners.

Also inspired by the psalms is our final Old Testament block, "Harp." The strings are visible in the center, reminding us to "Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving." (Ps 147:7).

The New Testament banner begins with the "Bethlehem Star," a variation on a classic quilt pattern. It heralds the events symbolized in the block to the right, "Christ is Born," which is a representation of the newborn King in the manger. Notice the same fabric in the star is repeated in the manger itself.

The next two blocks also go together to represent Palm Sunday: "Hosanna," a Hebrew word meaning "save us" was the cry of the people on that day. If you look from the outer corners inward you can see a palm branch pattern but the background field is the cross. "Road to Jerusalem" is the next block that shows the way Jesus traveled to accomplish our salvation.



The "Road to Jerusalem" leads directly to the "Crown of Thorns" and "Cross" blocks in the next row. Look closely in the circle for the four thorns pointing in towards the center.

To close the New Testament banner, there is a celebration of salvation accomplished with "Holy Spirit" and "Sound the Trumpets." While it is impossible to conceptualize the Holy Spirit in simple triangles and squares, there is a sense of both a radiating outward from the center and also a bringing together of individual triangles into a whole just as He brings each of us into the Holy Christian Church by creating faith in our hearts through the Word and Sacraments. The trumpets in the final block sound loudly and point back in the direction of the "Holy Spirit" block.

May these artistic representations enrich and encourage your meditation on God's Word today.
