

P: We conduct this service of thanksgiving and praise in the name of God the Father who created and preserves us, God the Son who has redeemed us, and God the Holy Spirit who has called us and sanctified us. **C:** Amen.

~ CONFESSION OF SINS AND ABSOLUTION~

P: Dear friends in Christ, aware of God's providence and grace, let us come before Him to confess our sins and look to Him in repentance and faith for forgiveness:

C: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against You in our thoughts, our desires, our words and our actions.

We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. Nor have we always given You the thanks and praise that is due Your holy name.

We beg You to have mercy on us, and for the sake of the Lord Jesus Christ forgive our wrongs.

Help us to delight in Your will and to walk in Your ways, giving thanks in all circumstances through Jesus Christ our Lord.

P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given His only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore rejoice and give thanks! God for Jesus' sake has removed your transgressions from you as far as east is from west. You are His own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to His will.

RESPONSIVE READING from Psalm 116:12-13, 17-19

- P: What shall I render to the LORD For all His benefits toward me?
 - C: I will take up the cup of salvation,

And call upon the name of the LORD.

- P: I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving,
 - C: And will call upon the name of the LORD.
- P: I will pay my vows to the LORD
 - C: Now in the presence of all His people,
- P: In the courts of the LORD's house,

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:18-22

Then King David went in and sat before the LORD and said, "Who am I, O Lord GOD, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? ¹⁹ And yet this was a small thing in your eyes, O Lord GOD. You have spoken also of your servant's house for a great while to come, and this is instruction for mankind, O Lord GOD! ²⁰ And what more can David say to you? For you know your servant, O Lord GOD! ²¹ Because of your promise, and according to your own heart, you have brought about all this greatness, to make your servant know it. ²² Therefore you are great, O LORD God. For there is none like you, and there is no God besides you, according to all that we have heard with our ears.

New Testament Reading: Philippians 4:4-9

⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. ⁵ Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

⁸ Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. ⁹ What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

Gospel Reading: Luke 7:36-50

³⁶ One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. ³⁷ And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when

she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, ³⁸ and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. ³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." ⁴⁰ And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it, Teacher."

⁴¹ "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" ⁴³ Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt." And he said to him, "You have judged rightly." ⁴⁴ Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. ⁴⁵ You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. ⁴⁶ You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. ⁴⁷ Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." ⁴⁸ And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." ⁴⁹ Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this, who even forgives sins?" ⁵⁰ And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

A Thanksgiving Confession of Faith

from Martin Luther's explanation to the First Article in the Large Catechism

P: Someone might ask, 'What sort of person is God? What does He do? How can one praise or picture or describe Him in a way that will really let people know Him? What do you know about Him?'

ALL: You could say: 'First, my God is the Father who made heaven and earth. I take nothing and no one else as God except Him alone, for there simply is no one else who could have made heaven and earth.'

P: What do you mean by those words?

<u>ALL:</u> What I mean to say and what I believe is that I am a creation of God, that is, He gave me and continuously preserves for me my body, soul, and life, <u>WOMEN:</u> my bodily members great and small, all my senses, my reason and intellect, and so on,

<u>MEN:</u> also food and drink, clothing, livelihood, wife and child, servants, house and home, and so on.

<u>ALL:</u> Besides this He causes the necessities and comforts of life to be provided for me by everything in creation – the sun, the moon, the stars in the sky, day and night, air, fire, water, the earth and all that it can produce, birds, fish, animals, grains and all manner of produce.

<u>WOMEN:</u> He also gives whatever other physical and temporal blessings there may be, such as good government, peace, and security.

<u>MEN:</u> It follows self-evidently that, since everything that we possess as well as everything else in heaven and on earth is daily given, sustained, and preserved by God,

<u>ALL:</u> therefore we in turn certainly owe it to Him to love, praise, and thank Him without ceasing and, in short, to serve Him wholly and completely, as He requires and enjoins us to do in the Ten Commandments. This is most certainly true.
