- **TODAY:** We are holding a special worship service in which we are jointly live streaming with our sister congregation, Grace Evangelistic Lutheran Church (GELC) of Paynesville, Liberia. GELC is constructing a new facility in which to worship and, while unfinished, they are going to start using it. They have asked Pastor Hein to preach for The idea developed to switch worship segments this occasion. between the two congregations. Should the technology fail during the service, we would proceed by doing the remaining worship at Grace. Otherwise, follow the directions in the bulletin by doing the USA portions and then by listening during the LIBR (Liberia) portions. The words are in the bulletin to assist in understanding the differences in dialect. While some portions will be in Loma, one of the tribal languages of Liberia, the people do speak what's called Sour English, basically with fewer verbs and abbreviated nouns. Also, Pastor Joseph Kwiwalazu often leads his congregation in the liturgy by first speaking the initial words and the congregation following. Obviously the differences in Western and African cultures will be noticeable.
- ◆ Among Us: Barb Crandall is continuing to receive hospice care at Lake Ridge in Buffalo. This past Friday, David Hein had an accident at work requiring surgery to retain his left arm. He lost his thumb. All three major bones in the arm were broken and repaired through plates. - CLC News: Retired professor, Paul Schaller, suffered a mild stroke on Tuesday evening and spent 24 hours in the hospital. The stroke symptoms went away with no apparent lasting effects. He is at home with medications and close monitoring. Please keep him and his family in your prayers during his recovery.

- Call for Nominations: The deadline is March 31 for nominations to CLC offices at our upcoming synod convention, June 20-23, 2024. Pastors, professors, male teachers, and voters of congregations within the Church of the Lutheran Confession are invited to nominate individuals for the following synodical offices: CLC President; CLC Vice-President; CLC Moderator; CLC Secretary; Called Servants for the Board of Trustees, Regents, Missions, and Education; Lay Members for the Board of Trustees, Regents, Missions, and Education. Nolting, 810 W 3rd St, Valentine, NE 69201. U.S. mail must be postmarked no later than March 31.
- ▶ **ILC Tour Choir:** For many years the ILC Tour Choir has been granted a special rate for using a charter bus during their yearly tour in holding concerts at various CLC congregations. This year that rate is being discontinued. After comparing the cost of using various bus companies, the common rate would be approximately \$11,000 higher than expected for budgetary reasons. Normally an offering is collected during the tour which will still happen. But this year CLC President Michael Wilke is authorizing this svnod-wide announcement to allow others to share in their support of the Tour Choir. This offering would help offset the extra expense needed for the bus. Therefore, if members of CLC congregations wish to support this, please designate your offering to "ILC Tour Choir."
- ➡ BELC Cyclone Aid: In early December, Cyclone Michaung struck the eastern coast of India and damaged and flooded churches of the BELC as well as the Martin Luther Bible School (MLBS) pastor training center. Eleven of the fourteen districts of the BELC were affected. A total of 55 churches, as well as the MLBS, were damaged by the cyclone and are in need of repair. The Board of Missions has approved \$12,000 of disaster relief to be sent from Kinship to assist with building repair and reconstruction. Please remember our brethren of the BELC in your prayers, and consider supporting this effort through offerings to Kinship.
