

Council Meeting Notes – January 12, 2025

Meeting opened with prayer. November Council meeting minutes were read and approved. There was no Council meeting in December.

Treasurer's Report

- November treasurer's report was presented and approved
- December treasurer's report was presented and approved excluding notes in bottom left. This report does not include offerings from New Year's Eve Service and will be reported in the January report.
- We discussed \$200 gift for organists and decided that the counters entered the gift correctly in the General Fund with a notation for Organist and authorized the Treasurer to distribute the money equally to the organists.
- The called workers gift will be divided equally by 5 (Pastor and 4 teachers) and distributed in January.
- Motion approved to state the Opening and Closing Balance directly from the Bank Statement with corresponding dates in the lower right of future treasurer's reports.

Pastor's Report

- A funeral for Melvin Eichstadt was held at Grace on Mon. December 16.
- Lenten pulpit rotation starts March 5 is planned with Berea & potentially Eden Prairie.

Board of Elders' Report

- Grace will be purchasing 10 hymnals for \$20 each (O Sing of Christ, the new hymnal from Messiah Eau Claire). The choir will use the hymnals initially.
- Grace received ~\$7,000 from the U.S. government for employee retention during the COVID-19 pandemic. These funds have been placed in the General Fund.
- Motion passed to recommend \$60,000 as the Cooperative Budget Plan number for 2025 to the voters. This is our goal for our offering to the CLC General Fund.

Board of Education Report

- As planned, Pre-Kindergarten will not be offered beyond the current school year.
- Planning for long-term tuition changes has been started.
- We are expecting to receive and install playground equipment from the City of Fridley once the weather is more suitable.
- An attempt will be made to recruit young adults to participate with the Ice Cream Social and the Christmas bags so the younger people can become more involved.
- Devin Vandeveer is now enrolled in the school.

Board of Trustees' Report

• There will be a work day on January 25. Business as usual is occurring with regular maintenance and other normal care of the property.

Other Business

- The plan is to define the position of Financial Secretary in the February Council meeting after the new Council members are elected.
- The Sanctuary Improvement Committee plans to remove upholstery from a single pew to figure how to replace the upholstery for all of the pews.

General Fund – In the month of December we received about \$28,000 more than we spent. This reduced the deficit in the fund to just over of \$83,000 compared to a year ago when it we had a deficit of under \$19,000. Contributions through December are down about \$36,000 compared to last year at this time.

ILC Operations – Revenue is up about \$63,000 over the same period as last year while disbursements are up about \$14,000.

ILC Building Projects – Year-to-date contributions have been about \$188,000. December brought a decline in the market value of the investments in this fund but there is still a positive increase in market value of approximately \$80,000 for the year.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of payments received of almost \$137,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, about \$131,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just under \$1,000 of contributions to the fund. Expenditures in December included a loan of \$150,000 to a congregation

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
