'For thus says the Lord Gop: "Indeed | Myself will search for My sheep and seek them out. 12 As a shepherd seeks out his flock on the day he is among his scattered sheep, so will I seek out My sheep and deliver them from all the places where they were scattered on a cloudy and dark day. 13 And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them to their own land: I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, in the valleys and in all the inhabited places of the country. 14 I will feed them in good pasture, and their fold shall be on the high mountains of Israel. Gospel Reading____Luke 15:1-10

1 Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." 3 So he told them this parable: 4 "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? 5 And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. 6 And when he comes

Matthew 28:19a

Jesus says to go and make disciples. That's a daunting task. In fact, it's so daunting that anyone who takes an honest and introspective inventory of their gifts and abilities would have to admit that they are not up to the task. And isn't this exactly what Satan loves for us to do? Because when we stop looking to Jesus and focus on ourselves, one of two things will most likely happen. We will either become like the Pharisees who thought too highly of their ability to please the Lord in and of themselves. Or we will be led to utter despair as we consider our sinful flesh and our inability to please the Lord.

When it comes to making disciples, we look to Jesus, not to ourselves. We look to the life changing message of sins forgiven that Jesus accomplished on the cross as revealed in the words of Scripture. We are then reminded, by Scripture, that it is the Holy Spirit who calls, gathers, and enlightens every single disciple of Jesus. Sure, Jesus uses sinners like us to deliver Gospel in word and sacrament, but the power is in the message, not in the one who delivers it. That is precisely why the Apostle Paul could boldly proclaim:

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes... **Romans 1:16**

And praise be to God for the power of His Gospel because it takes the pressure off the one who delivers that message and refreshes and encourages us for the privilege of being His ambassador!
