Mission Helper Trip:

On Sunday, June 26th the volunteers for the 2005 Mission Helper Trip to India will depart from Chicago O'Hare airport at 9:20 PM following a brief meeting and commissioning service at the church in Chicago. After two days of travel and a bonus 27-hour layover in London the group of 13 volunteers will arrive in Chennai India at 3:55 AM on June

28th. On Thursday morning, June 29th, the mission helpers will travel by train to Nellore where everyone will meet Pastor Moses and help celebrate the birthday of his son, Enoch. The next day the volunteers will then proceed by train to Nidibrole, the headquarters, orphanage, and seminary of the CLCI. Following two days of visiting the orphanage and surrounding congregations the group of thirteen will divide into three groups. One group will be staying in Nidibrole where Pastor Paul Nolting will teach CLCI seminary classes in the morning and then will be joined by Kristen Nolting, Lindsey Paul, and Dana Wuerch in the afternoon to teach VBS outreach classes in different, Hindu dominated villages each afternoon. The other volunteers will head South again by train. Pastor Nathanael Mayhew, Peter Evensen, Mike Gurath, and Paul Tiefel III will travel as far as Nellore, which serves as headquarters for the Northern districts of the BELC. Pastor Mayhew will teach pastoral training courses in the Nellore, Cuddapah, and Renigunta districts of the BELC and will be joined by the other three each afternoon and evening to teach VBS to the children of several villages. The five remaining volunteers will continue south to Chennai by train where they will begin their duties. Pastor Todd Ohlmann will teach pastoral classes in the mornings in the Nagalapuram, Chennai, and Vanniyambadi districts of the BELC. Each afternoon Candy Ohlmann, Liz Povolny, Tamar Reim, and Josh Ohlmann will travel with Pastor Ohlmann to area villages to conduct VBS with the children. We are estimating that these three groups of volunteers together will have the opportunity to teach as many as 3,000 children the saving message of the Gospel. For most of these children it will be the first opportunity they have had to truly hear about their Savior. For many it will be the first time they have even heard the name of Jesus. Following the VBS an evangelism service will be held for the parents of the children and anyone else in the village who would like to come. On July 20th the 2005 Mission Helper team will arrive back in the U.S.

Please keep these men and women in your prayers. Pray for their safety, pray for their families that God would fill them with courage and comfort as their loved ones are so far away, pray for their health and wellbeing, pray mostly for the success of their efforts, pray for the souls of those who sit in the darkness of unbelief that they may hear the Good News of Salvation and turn in faith to the Lord for forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life, pray also for the pastors and members of the CLCI and the BELC who work tirelessly to spread the Gospel and host the CLC mission helpers. STANDARD OF TRUTH

This writer has learned a bit about carpentry and home construction over the last years. However he is not ready to do fine carpentry or undertake the construction of a home. Two left hands as the saying goes, as well as not enough patience. One thing is clear however. To build anything there have to be standards.

It simply does not work to build a home or do carpentry by eyeballing width and length, or angles and lines. One needs a tape measure. But even the tape measure is of little benefit if one cannot read it, or confuses the fractions of inches. It hardly seems possible that the difference between an eighth and a sixteenth can make a difference. A builder and a carpenter know it does. So does an amateur carpenter.

Scripture speaks of the Church as constructed upon the doctrine of the Apostles and Prophets, "Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, in whom the whole building being joined together grows into a holy temple in the Lord" (Ephesians 2:20,21). If pastors are going to be instruments of blessing their teaching must be built upon the Word. Their teaching and that of the church itself is to be judged by whether or

not in their ministry Christ is the Cornerstone by which all else is measured and established.

A particular teaching or doctrine is not correct simply because the pastor teaches it or the church supports it! It is not correct because the church headquarters or the pope passed it down. It is not correct simply because it is what the church has always taught or because



what is done is the way the church has always done a particular thing (tradition). Conversely, something is not error because a church, a pastor, or a member says it is, or thinks it is. Something is not wrong simply because someone does not like what is being taught or practiced.

The standard of truth and error, right and wrong, is Scripture, God's Word. One may even believe that and still have it wrong if he does not understand Scripture. Remember the tape measure. You not only have to have one; you have to know how to read it! What is taught in the Church has to be measured by the standard of Scripture. A Bible student will recognize that he is not the interpreter of the Bible, but that the Bible is its own interpreter.

In determining truth from error and right from wrong we do not want to use (abuse) Scripture. We want to pray and then read it, study it, listen to it – it is the voice of God – and follow where Scripture leads. With that approach we cannot go wrong. We will not be misled. Indeed our Lord will bless.
