WHAT ATTRACTS PEOPLE TO A CHURCH? First of all what is the Church? The Church in the real sense of the Word is composed of "called-out" ones, that is, people who have been called out of unbelief. It consists of believers only, that is all those who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and who believe that their sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Christ is both the Head and the Foundation of Church which is His body, of which each believer is a part (Ephesians 2:19-22), and which we confess in the Creed as the Holy Christian Church.

One is <u>not attracted</u> to the Church. One is <u>brought into</u> it through the gracious working of the Spirit of God. The Spirit of God works through the Means of Grace, the blessed Gospel of salvation. "... It is by faith in the Gospel alone that men become members of the Christian Church" (*Brief Statement*, 1932,

p.12). Since there are no imperfections in the body of Christ there are no hypocrites in the Holy Christian Church.

This Church is identified with no denomination. Membership in the Holy Christian Church is through faith, and faith alone. At the same time, while we are in the world it is God's will that believers, His children, gather together around Word and Sacrament. They who gather together around Word and Sacrament identify one another by the confession of the mouth. A prerequisite for church membership among us is agreement in faith and confession. We recognize one another, e.g. in our Lutheran church, through <u>verbal</u> confession of faith. We acknowledge one another as fellow believers on the basis of what we hear, because we cannot read the heart.

So what is it that attracted members of our church to identify with it? We choose to believe that members are here because they were drawn by the Word, and by the faithfulness to the Word that is preached every Sunday. Since members of our church have at heart the welfare of their souls, and desire the assurance of salvation, they want only the Word of God and not a mixture of human wisdom and Scripture, or tradition and Scripture.

But we live in a day of gross theological shallowness. In this shallowness people have little if any understanding of what the Holy Christian Church is, and what the commission of the Church is. This shallowness is grossly evident in what it is that attracts many people to a church. Contributing to this sad state of affairs are churches themselves which have become more corporate than spiritual, more entertaining than theological, and more mercenary than faithful to the Word.

The headline in the Corpus Christi *Caller-Times* (August 6, 2005) reads: "Some churches try variety of names- Attempts made to attract new participants." So a church in Milwaukee has changed its name. This is not unique in our age. This is all part of the so-called church growth movement which promotes mega churches "in which denominational identities are eliminated or downplayed for broader appeal in an era when people shop for churches." Shop for churches? Then how about this one in Portland across the bridge? An invitation came informing us of "A church that's not just a worship service & tradition. It's time for a change ... New worship gathering every Sunday @ 10:30 a.m. at EXPRESSO.COM ... Shorts, Shirt, & Shoes Welcome ... Free coffee drink/ smoothie for all guests." We know of a church that advertised that they invited motorcycle bikers. The pastor rode his Harley-Davidson down the church aisle to identify with the bikers.

The more people are satisfied to be religious without regard to substance, the more inclined they are to be persuaded by the size of the church building, the number of people that attend, contemporary worship, youth groups, opportunities for seniors, gymnasiums, etc. This mindset is encouraged by churches that change their name so that they don't offend anyone by their name- what does a community church stand for theologically, what is its confessional position? Even Lutheran churches that compromise God's Word to be more attractive to the masses feed this false mindset. Many churches appeal to the emotion of church shoppers whose spirituality is no deeper than what makes them feel good. But an Anglican priest quoted in the most recent *Lutheran Commentator* got it right when he said, "We must get away from the 'gentle Jesus come and squeeze us when it please us.'"

The Apostle Paul declared that he had not shied away from bringing the Ephesians the "whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). That meant that Paul preached the Law to uncover sin, and condemn the sinner. But Paul was a compassionate preacher. He brought the Gospel message that the troubled sinners might be comforted, and find the certainty of salvation in the meritorious atonement of the Lord Jesus. Paul himself was a member of the Body of Christ because He had been drawn by Christ and the Gospel, and therefore in keeping with the Lord's commission in Matthew 28:19-20 "Pastor" Paul said to the Corinthians, "I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2) We would be delighted if the walls of our church bulged and we had to build bigger. We are not averse in principle to utilizing modern means of communication to carry out the responsibility of the Church. We recognize that different approaches may be necessary in different cultures.

But we are not ashamed of who we are; we are not apologetic for what we preach- how can we apologize for God's Word? We will not change who and what we are and what we believe to be more attractive to church shoppers! We are more interested in being tools in God's hand to build the HOLY CHRISTIAN CHURCH, than we are in attracting people into the church. Our first and only concern is to be faithful to God's Word. Our message shall continue to be first and foremost the message of eternal salvation in Christ. If that is "attractive" to people, the Lord be praised! Therefore we issue our invitation to:

"All who are in distress of mind and heart because of their guilt and condemnation in the sight of Almighty God, and who seek the pardon and comfort, which only the Gospel of Jesus Christ can give;

All who are bewildered by the confusion of many voices offering the theories of human wisdom in the name of religion, and who desire to hear the voice of the Good Shepherd Whom God raised from the dead and of Whom we are witnesses;

All who, though members of Christian churches have come to fear or to know that their churches have departed from the truth of Holy Scripture and therefore "ask for the old paths where the good way is ..." (Jeremiah 6:16);

All who have strayed from the faith and desire to be restored to the Shepherd and Overseer of their souls (1 Peter 2:25)" (CLC *Statement of Faith and Purpose*).

"But as we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, which trieth our hearts" (1 Thessalonians 2:4).
