



Sermon: 1 Kings 23:1-6

(1) Now the king sent them to gather all the elders of Judah and Jerusalem to him. (2) The king went up to the house of the LORD with all the men of Judah, and with him all the inhabitants of Jerusalem; the priests and the prophets and all the people, both small and areat. And he read in their hearing all the words of the Book of the Covenant which had been found in the house of the LORD. (3) Then the king stood by a pillar and made a covenant before the LORD, to follow the LORD and to keep His commandments and His testimonies and His statutes, with all his heart and all his soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. And all the people took a stand for the covenant. (4) And the king commanded Hilkiah the high priest, the priests of the second order, and the doorkeepers, to bring out of the temple of the LORD all the articles that were made for Baal, for Asherah, and for all the host of heaven; and he burned them outside Jerusalem in the fields of Kidron, and carried their ashes to Bethel. (5) Then he removed the idolatrous priests whom the kings of Judah had ordained to burn incense on the high places in the cities of Judah and in the places all around Jerusalem, and those who burned incense to Baal, to the sun, to the moon, to the constellations, and to all the host of heaven. (6) And he brought out the wooden image from the house of the LORD, to the Brook Kidron outside Jerusalem, burned it at the Brook Kidron and ground *it* to ashes, and threw its ashes on the graves of the common people. 



October Voters Meeting Highlights

The meeting was opened with prayer at 11:40. The Voters meeting minutes from April and July were read and accepted. Highlights of the Council meetings from the past quarter were read. The treasurer's report was accepted.

<u>Pastors report</u>: Membership changes includes the addition of the James and Jenny Squires family from Berea and the removal of Phil Flesner. VBS was successful with 33 children in attendance. The changes in the Fellowship Hall have been helpful for teaching and fellowshipping. The Men's retreat was conducive to fellowship and growing in God's Word. Pastor will have upcoming ear surgeries. Pastoral visits are progressing. There have been 1,300 hits from 450 people (ave. of 5/day) on our web site.

<u>Elders</u>: Motion was accepted to terminate the membership of Eric Radichel. A motion was accepted to revise the evening services for 2005 from 7:30 to 7:00 pm. This would affect the Thanksgiving Eve and the midweek Advent services.

Education: The playground equipment is installed. School started with 11 students. The volunteer picnic went well. CEA meeting on Oct. 14. Nov. 11 is tentatively planned for a school lock-in for the upper grades. Teachers' Conference is Oct. 19-21 in Okabena, MN. Lights and ballasts have yet to be addressed. Bulletin boards need to be moved.

<u>Trustees</u>: Thanks to all that helped with all of the things that have been accomplished. Workday on Oct. 29, working on putting together a master list.

<u>Building Committee</u>: The project is progressing. Carpet is not planned for the fellowship hall.

<u>Delegate Conference Report</u>: Dave Rust reported on June 12th Conf. in Sleepy Eye, and Benno Sydow reported on Sept. 18th Conf. in Eagle lake.

<u>Coordinating Council Report</u>: Phil Radichel reported on the serious budgetary challenges that the CLC is confronted with, a potential 100,000 deficit in the coming months. A motion was made and accepted to create a committee to write a letter to the CLC in order to give guidance to the CLC budgeting process.

- "We conclude that a man is justified by faith, without the deeds of the Law' (Romans 3:28). But we teach that this faith is a gift of God, created in our heart by the Holy Spirit, not fashioned or formed by our own acts …" (2684).

- "The perfectly pure, the only, and the certain Word of God must be the foundation of our faith" (2693)

- "Faith is an unceasing and constant looking which turns the eyes upon nothing but Christ, the Victor over sin and death and the Giver of righteousness, salvation and life eternal" (1374).
