Again, thank you for all you do, and may the Lord continue to richly bless your work among us. In Christ, Paul Lentz (President at Grace)



CHRISTMAS IS PAST. SO WHAT NOW?

Unfortunately for most Christmas is past. For sure Christmas is past for those to whom it was just an excuse for a day off, a party, or shopping. It is also past for those who use it for nothing more than to promote a temporal peace in a world of evil and corruption. But shall it be past for a Christ believer? It need not be. Christ believers are not always consciously walking about through the year thinking about Christmas. But as they worship the Lord Jesus and faithfully follow Him

from the lowly manger in a stable, along the path of suffering to the cruel cross, to the grave, and the resurrection, and finally to the exalted mountain of ascension, Christmas lives in the heart. The celebration of Christmas is the celebration of the Savior's birth- it is also the celebration of a purpose. Jesus was not born to titillate the emotions or to give society an opportunity to celebrate, it knows not what. Jesus said, "... For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the



He cannot however drag those down to hell who recognize their weakness and who in faith embrace the Savior Jesus Christ. Such as embrace Jesus in faith never weary of bowing at the manger to worship the God-Man, God's Son and our Savior. They are not ashamed to admit their own sin and inadequacy and to bow as lowly shepherds at the manger, and are not ashamed to be recognized as one of "that man's disciples." They will sit as penitents at the cross. They recognize that the birth of Christ does not exist in a vacuum but that its message lives and resonates in Jesus' words on the cross and in the angelic message of the risen Christ. God's people rejoice in the peace that comes through the fulfilled purpose of Jesus' coming, and declared through the Gospel, "Unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior ..." (Luke 2: 11). Jesus was born "this day" that all our days might be filled with the joy and hope of salvation realized in its ultimate fullness when our Father releases us from the bondage of this foreign environment in which we now exist. Christmas is not past for any who appreciate the fact that Jesus came to save them from their sins. So what now? Let the Word of God dwell in you richly and "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, rejoice" (Philippians 4:4). Christ lives, and so does the hope of all in whose heart He finds room each day.
