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IN CHRIST "ALL ISRAEL" SHALL BE SAVED:

The full number of all believers in Christ from Abraham to the present, begotten through the Gospel (1 Corinthians 4:15), constitutes the new nation of God. Scripture calls this spiritual assembly "an holy nation, His own special people" (1 Peter 2:9). Under the circumstances it pained Paul that his own people had lost this favored status. Paul cared about his people. He said, "I have great sorrow and continual grief in my heart" (Romans 9:2). But then he said, "But it is not that the Word of God has taken no effect. For they are not all Israel who are of Israel, nor are they all children because they are the seed of Abraham; but in Isaac your seed shall be called. That is, those who are the children of the flesh these are not the children of God; but the children of promise are counted as seed" (Romans 9: 6-8). Physical descent from Abraham does not make one a true child (spiritual descendent) of Abraham. They are true children of Abraham, and heirs of the promise who are of the faith of Abraham.

Though the people of Israel rejected Christ, God is faithful. He keeps promise. There were still those in Israel who did not reject Christ, though the people as a nation did. In writing to the Romans, Paul reminded them of how the Lord assured Elijah that in those dark days there were still 7,000 who had not bowed before Baal. Likewise now, "at this present time there is a remnant according to the election of grace" (Romans 11:5). Those who remained were not favored by reason of merit or self-righteousness, but by the election of grace!

For those who were cut off there is a way back. Paul wrote that Israel's rejection was not final "if they do not continue in unbelief" (Romans 11).

With Israel's rejection, Paul turned to the Gentiles (Acts 13:46). With Israel's love of darkness it was now the time for the light (Christ) to shine upon the Gentiles. This is a cause for rejoicing among the Gentiles, vet not a reason for smugness or boasting. God the Father is faithful to His promises and He will bring to pass His saving will among the Gentiles. Nevertheless, Gentiles among whom are we, disregard Christ and Paul's exhortation - at peril to themselves. Paul wrote, "And if some of the branches [Israel] be broken off, and thou, [Gentiles] being a wild olive tree, were grafted in among them, and with them partakest of the root and fatness of the olive tree; Boast not against the branches. But if thou boast, thou bearest not the root, but the root thee. Thou wilt say then, the branches were broken off, that I might be grafted in. Well; because of unbelief they were broken off, and thou standest by faith. Be not high-minded, but fear: For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee" (Romans 11:17-21). Israel's refusal became the Gentile's opportunity - vet by grace and not merit of their own. Israel became enemies of God, but remained the beloved of God "who is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). Israel may have turned its back on Christ,

but the Lord's face is always toward the sinner! Of the Jews we read, "If they do not continue in unbelief, (they) will be grafted in, for God is able to graft them in again" (Romans 11:23).

Given the circumstances by which the Gospel has come to us, and given God's desire for Israel, we will neither rejoice at the loss to the Jew, nor boast of our blessing. There is no place for conceit in that "hardening in part has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in" (Romans 11:25). At the judgment day, it will be revealed that the elect from among the Gentiles <u>and</u> the Jews will enter heaven, and so "all Israel", those who hold the faith of Abraham, will be saved.

We reiterate, there is no room for smugness on our part. Rather we will humbly rejoice in the grace of God, and in the Savior Christ in Whom the Spirit of God has blessed us with the riches of salvation.

God the Father is true to His promises. He Who has redeemed all people promises salvation to as many as repent of their sins and call upon the name of the Lord Jesus. But God's promise is always in connection with Jesus Christ. "...Whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). "There is none other name under heaven, given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). Whether Jew or Gentile, it is true, "that whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Acts 2: 21), while "He who does not have the Son of God does not have life" (1 John 5:12). Now we know that Satan is ever seeking to rob us of our salvation. He will attempt to fill our hearts with conceit over against the Jews; he will seek to lead us into a false sense of security through a perverted interpretation of "once saved always saved." He will tempt us by the pleasures of this world, and try to focus our attention on things on earth rather than in heaven. He will tempt us to forsake the Word of God or compromise the Word, or even trade the Word of God for the tasteless and bland mush of shallow religiosity, which is the staple of today! He will attempt to make us neglectful of Word and Sacrament.

Thank God whose gifts and calling are irrevocable (Romans 11: 29). He has among the Jews His elect who standing in the faith of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob rejoice in their election, even as we. At the same time, Romans 11:22 tells us that if we abuse the goodness of God and reject Christ, as grafted branches we can be cut off again! God forbid that any of us who are so favored with the Gospel of salvation and faith in Christ should by reason of rejection and unbelief end up on the brush pile. The Heavenly Father never turns His back on us but daily invites our penitential prayers. May God help us to "hold fast" (Revelation 3:11) what we have been given until Jesus comes again, and "all Israel" shall be saved. This is the good and gracious will and promise of God!
