### "WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FOR FROM JESUS?"

Welcome to our guests and visitors. We appreciate the opportunity to share God's Word with you today. Please come again! Those interested in learning more about the Scriptures and our doctrinal position, please speak with Pastor Hein. He would be delighted to visit with you!

So one will ask what then can we do to keep our young people and any others (it's not only a youth problem) who are endangering their souls by dropping out?

- 1. Preach the Word with all diligence, and faithfulness.
- 2. Let the Word of God dwell richly among us in home and church
- 3. Through their worship and faith activity let parents in the home set a good example for their children.
- 4. If possible begin a Christian Day school, and where there is one, utilize it, as well as Immanuel Lutheran high School.
- 5. Utilize the Sunday School, Bible Class, and catechism class, and let pastor and teacher give themselves to careful preparation
- 6. Take time to visit with the youth of the congregation about spiritual things as well as about other things that interest them
- 7. Seize the opportunities to share with one another and with the youth the blessings of continuing in the faithful Word.
- 8. Preach the Word, Preach the Word, Preach the Word!

We must face the fact that we are dealing with the sinful flesh, and many evil influences. Many faithful parents and congregations as well as pastors have endured the heartache of seeing children forsake the paths. Even one of the Lord's disciples- Judas, by name- spurned the love and grace of Christ, and was lost. As surely as we preach and teach, and maintain the means of grace, Satan is knocking at the back door inviting people to enjoy the enticements and pleasures of the world on the outside. The answer to Satan is not to figure out programs, schemes, or godly enticements in order to close the back door. The Lord Himself gives us the answer. "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables. But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry" (2 Timothy 4: 2-5).

But let us recognize this truth- and this we say not to minimize our concern, or excuse indifference. We say it because it is our hope, accompanied with prayer. Where the Word of God has been preached, and children have been brought up in the way of the Lord, and to know the Gospel, God can bring them back again. They, as we all, may forget Him, but He does not forget us. While they may be a "loss to the church," the Lord can keep them unto salvation. When they appreciate that, the sooner they will be led, we pray, to rejoin us in our confessional fellowship around Word and Sacrament. It is up to us to see to it that if and when such a reawakening comes, they will have something to which to return! To no supposed good end or hope dare we give place to methodology at the expense of theology – God's Word - in order to entice or keep our youth.

"Send out Thy light and Thy truth. Let them lead me. Let them bring me unto Thy holy hill, and to Thy tabernacles" (Psalm 43:3).

#### **CLOSING THE BACK DOOR:**

One of the concerns that occupies churches is how to keep young people active in the church. As a pastor I have the same concerns about our church body, as well as our own congregation. As a confessional Lutheran pastor I have concerns, as I am sure do others of our fellowship, because of the implication for the future of our church body. But *more importantly* our concerns revolve around implications having to do with the spiritual and eternal welfare of the young people.

"Forward in Christ" [January 2006] (Old-timers know it as "The Northwestern Lutheran") reports that the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) "explored the reason why youth are leaving the WELS." This was done over the period of two years and was "conducted by an independent, non-WELS research firm" which utilized a "focus group" of young people 17-24 years of age. To "make the process totally objective," they engaged an outside research firm which we find mildly curious. We of course do not know, but it is unlikely that this research firm addressed spiritual matters. It certainly could not respond to spiritual concerns in a pastoral manner if any were expressed. We are told that the 12 young people responded by "pouring out their hearts, admitting their shortcomings, demonstrating their faith, and not wanting to radically reconstruct WELS, but wanting it to be more responsive, more caring, more communicative, and more in touch."

So what are some recommendations in the 112-page report to the "Commission on Youth Discipleship"? It does suggest, "to lobby parents more aggressively, communicating the critical role they play in their children's future WELS relationship." Pastor and congregation are to better tune in to the needs and interests of their youth. "Congregations need to reduce the degree of repetitiveness in worship service and consider some music variation. They should also evaluate opportunities/potential to incorporate some contemporary aspects into religious services." "The current feeling that

'young adults don't count' needs to be reversed." The report also did encourage increased efforts toward those leaving for or who were away at college, as well as post high school youth not in college. It also encouraged continued efforts at promotion of the Lutheran Elementary schools.

The problem is identifiable! Young people are becoming less and less active, and are leaving the church. How to address the problem is the difficulty. But let us recognize with thanksgiving to the Lord that many young people *are faithful to the Lord and are remaining active*.

Young people who remain faithful and active undoubtedly are subjected to the same societal influences, the same passions, the same temptations, the same fears, and the same ideals and goals of those who are inactive and are leaving. *Therefore, more helpful than an outside research firm study would be gathering young people who are active and engaged, and finding out why they are.* 

The Word of God is essential to keeping young people or old people faithful in hearing the Word and active in the congregation. We need to preach Law and Gospel. Young and old need the Law no matter how uncomfortable it is to preach it or to hear it. We need it because it uncovers our sinful condition. "Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God" (Romans 3:19). Only in hearts crushed by the Law can the Gospel seed take root. Only to such as realize that in their flesh they are beggars before God can the redemption that is in Christ Jesus give hope and joy. Only God's grace that brings salvation can win the heart, and only grace can sustain the heart. Grace alone creates a desire to love and worship "the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul and with all thy mind" (Matthew 4:10; 22:37). It is the Gospel alone that works faith, as well as appreciation manifest through faithfulness.

One thing is for sure- if the church has to become program oriented or water down its heritage to keep its youth we need to ask the question. For what are we keeping them- for the church or unto salvation? If the church has to change itself to close the back door to youth, it will not serve the youth (and likely not keep them) and it will probably lose the older generation. Furthermore, if programs are important to keep interest in church and the Gospel, no confessional Lutheran congregation can "out-program" the so-called "evangelicals" and still be recognized as a confessional Lutheran church! Possibly this reveals a bias, but so be it. If introducing "contemporary aspects into religious services" is the necessity of the future, can contemporary theology be far behind? Witness yet another church movement afoot. Something called *Connection Power News* said in an announcement January 23, 2006 "*The movements with the widest influence and greatest shelf life have been those that first, are doctrinally neutral, i.e. focusing on methodology rather than theology*..." Contemporary theology soon becomes no theology!

In the face of such foolishness, the Church has the responsibility to feed the sheep diligently. The pastor has a responsibility to "shepherd the flock" - young and old. There is no question that in addressing this concern, parents, pastor, and congregation must engage in introspection to examine their faithfulness to their particular responsibility as given by the Lord and as ones that must give account.
