STRONGER THAN THE MOUNTAINS:

The child of God---the Christ believer--- is beset in this world by the devil, world, and flesh. In addition the forces of evil align themselves to abuse the child of God. The hatred of the world is not unexpected, if we will faithfully confess the faith and cling to the Lord Jesus. Jesus said, "Remember the word that I said unto you, the servant is not greater than his lord. If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you; if they have kept my saying, they will keep yours also. But all these things will they do unto you for my name's sake, because they know not him that sent me" (John 15:20-21). Under the stress of the world's animosity, it may appear that the Lord has forgotten us.

In addition, we at times because of our own indifference and neglect invite the discipline of the Lord. Discipline itself can also be severe. But the writer of the book of Hebrews records the purpose of chastening or correction that occurs in the life of the Christian. "And ye have forgotten the exhortation which speaks unto you as unto children, My son, despise not thou the chastening of the Lord, nor faint when thou art rebuked of him: For whom the Lord loves he chastens, and scourges every son whom he receives. If ye endure chastens, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chastens not?" (Hebrews 12:5-7).

To whom shall we turn to endure the hatred of the world? The children of God turn to the Father and listen to His Word. What shall we do when we are chastened and disciplined? Children of God turn in penitent sorrow to the Father. Isaiah 54 is so eminently comforting in our various conditions of life:

<u>"Fear not;</u> for thou shalt not be ashamed: neither be thou confounded; for thou shalt not be put to shame: for thou shalt forget the shame of thy youth, and shalt not remember the reproach of thy widowhood any more. For thy Maker is thine husband; the LORD of hosts is his name; and thy Redeemer the Holy One of Israel; The God of the whole earth shall he be called ... For a small moment have I forsaken thee; but with great mercies will I gather thee. In a little wrath I hid my face from thee for a moment; but with everlasting kindness will I have mercy on thee, saith the LORD thy Redeemer. For this is as the waters of Noah unto me: for as I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth; so have I sworn that I would not be wroth (angry) with thee, nor rebuke thee. For the

mountains shall depart, and the hills be removed; but my kindness shall not depart from thee, neither shall the covenant of my peace be removed, saith the LORD that hath mercy on thee. O thou afflicted, tossed with tempest, and not comforted,

behold, I will lay thy stones with fair colors, and lay thy foundations with sapphires. And I will make thy windows of agates, and thy gates of carbuncles (crystal), and all thy borders of pleasant stones. And all thy children shall be taught of the LORD; and great shall be the peace of thy children. In righteousness shalt thou be established: thou shalt be far from oppression; for thou shalt not fear: and from terror; for it shall not come



<u>near thee</u>. Behold, they shall surely gather together, but not by me: <u>whosoever shall gather together against thee shall fall for</u> <u>thy sake</u> ... No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn. <u>This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD</u>, and their righteousness is of me, saith the LORD."

We cannot deny the seriousness of the difficulties, afflictions, trial, and tests that the child of God must endure in this world, some from the world, others of our own making--- a consequence of sin. Jesus' temptation in the wilderness was real (Matthew 4). He was severely tried and tested in the garden (Matthew 26). In each case He turned to the Word and to His Father. Therein lies the deliverance of our own body and soul. God the Father does not forsake His children. He has redeemed us with the holy precious blood of His only begotten Son. He cannot forget His children, His adopted children in Christ Jesus. It is His word to us!

The Apostle Paul wrote, "For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18). How could Paul be so sure? He endured, and we endure and may be at peace because *God's love, His kindness, His mercy, is stronger than the mountains.* The covenant of peace He made with us in Christ is unassailable, for "<u>the mountains shall depart, and the hills be removed; but my kindness shall not depart from thee, neither shall the covenant of my peace be removed, saith the LORD that hath mercy on thee."</u>
