

**Sermon:** *Luke 1:5-25* 

First Sunday

of Advent

(5) There was in the days of Herod, the king of Judea, a certain priest named Zacharias, of the division of Abijah. His wife was of the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. (6) And they were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless. (7) But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren, and they were both well advanced in years. (8) So it was, that while he was serving as priest before God in the order of his division, (9) according to the custom of the priesthood, his lot fell to burn incense when he went into the temple of the Lord. (10) And the whole multitude of the people was praying outside at the hour of incense. (11) Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing on the right side of the altar of incense. (12) And when Zacharias saw him, he was troubled, and fear fell upon him. (13) But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zacharias, for your prayer is heard; and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. (14) "And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth. (15) "For he will be great in the sight of the Lord, and shall drink neither wine nor strong drink. He will also be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. (16) "And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God. (17) "He will also go before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah, 'to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children,' and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." (18) And Zacharias said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is well advanced in years." (19) And the angel answered and said to him, "I am Gabriel, who stands in the presence of God, and was sent to speak to you and bring you these glad tidings. (20) "But behold, you will be mute and not able to speak until the day these things take place, because you did not believe my words which will be fulfilled in their own time." (21) And the people waited for Zacharias, and marveled that he lingered so long in the temple. (22) But when he came out, he could not speak to them; and they perceived that he had seen a vision in the temple, for he beckoned to them and remained speechless. (23) And so it was, as soon as the days of his service were completed, that he departed to his own house. (24) Now after those days his wife Elizabeth conceived; and she hid herself five months, saying, (25) "Thus the Lord has dealt with me, in the days when He looked on *me*, to take away my reproach among people." ( $NKJV^{TM}$ )



## **ADVENT AGAIN!**

Advent is a season of preparation for Christians. Consisting of the first 4 Sundays of the new church year, it is the season during which we prepare to celebrate the birthday of the incarnate Christ. All of us for however many years old we are have observed this season in which we prepare ourselves with prayer, and contemplation of the historical fact, as well as the significance of the birth of the Lord Jesus Christ. The season of Advent prior to the birth of Jesus lasted

4,000 years - through the whole Old Testament period from the time of the first promise given to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden after the fall. Being born 6 months before Jesus, John the Baptist spanned the two testaments. In his adulthood he fulfilled the purpose of his



ministry by preparing the way for the Savior Who would shortly embark on His ministry. John's message was, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord..." (John 1:23).

This is the message of the Advent preparation. John's message calls us to repentance and faith, and to put away all the baggage that prevents us from focusing on the real purpose of the birth of Jesus. In Christ we are to see the Lamb of God, which takes away the sin of the world. They who see in Jesus the fulfillment of God's promise, and who cling to Him as the Savior from sin, and Bearer of eternal life will have had a blessed Christmas.

When we celebrate Christmas we celebrate an historical, space-time event that has occurred. It is history, yet not cold and musty. Each day of our life is lived in the power and under the grace of God through Whose Spirit Christ is a living reality. Through faith we recognize that Christmas is an every day event in our life. Each moment we spend around Word and Sacrament is a moment in which the Lord comes into our lives with His blessing! As at His birth when no room was found for Him in the homes of Bethlehem, sadly in this intervening time between birth and judgment the majority have no room for Him. Rejecting the Word, and despising the Sacrament there is no room for Him in heart or home.

There is another aspect to Advent. It too is observed at this time. In reality however this observation has no season for we are called to observe the whole period of our life from birth to death as a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. Whereas Christ's birth has occurred, Christ's coming again lies in the future. There are some similarities to the time before His birth. The similarity lies in the fact of His coming- it was prophesied then and now. Further the time of His coming was hidden from men, known only to the Father who selected the fullness of time. The time of His coming in judgment is known to God, but not to man.

There is also dissimilarity. When He came in the flesh at birth, He came in lowliness. When He comes again He will come in glory and power, attended by the angels of heaven. When He came into the flesh He came to die for the sins of the world; when He comes in judgment He will come to take the saved home and cast away those who have had no time for Him.

Each day that passes brings us closer to the Advent of our Lord. We appreciate the rich significance of His first Advent personally at the occurrence of His second. The purpose of His birth for us will be fulfilled when He invites, "Come ye blessed of My Father; inherit the kingdom prepared forms from the foundation of the world."

for you from the foundation of the world ..." (Matthew 25:34).

The question of whether one will go to heaven or hell on the last day is not decided on judgment day. It is determined in the here and the now! Therefore, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord." There is no time like now to hear and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus said, "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me. To him that overcomes will I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my Father in his throne. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says unto the churches" (Revelation 3:20-22).

Teach us in watchfulness and prayer
To wait for the appointed hour
And fit us by Thy grace to share
The triumphs of Thy conquering power (TLH 64:5)

The time of Advent watching is stressful. The fruit of Advent fulfillment is joy everlasting for those who have been faithfully waiting and watching.
