Board of Trustees Report


- Pat will contact the maintenance person regarding material costs for furnace maintenance.

LENT IS UPON US: What is Lent? For the child of God, Lent is a season of penitence and sorrow over sin. But Lent is not about us. Lent is about the Lord Jesus Christ. During the season of Lent our concentration is on the cross of the Lord Jesus. Though Lent is not about us, the blessings of the cross fall out to us from the gracious heart of our Lord. These are blessings of which the sorrowful Christian can never hear enough. Unfortunately the appreciation of, if not the blessings, of Lent are denied to many because the season of Lent is lightly regarded by many, and distorted (Mardi Gras) by others, as well as trivialized by those who see it as nothing more than a season of meritorious self-denial.

During Lent we sit at the cross as the altar upon which the innocent Son of God was offered for the sins of the world. On this altar He shed His blood that we might be cleansed and purified for heaven. Consider:

Is it forgiveness of sins that we need? The Bible tells us: "In Whom (Christ) we have redemption through His blood, even the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" (Ephesians 1:7). Is it justification before the righteous God that we need? "Being now justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him" (Romans 5:9). Do we need the peace of a good conscience? The Bible tells us that in Christ we have "peace through the blood of His cross" (Colossians 1:20). Do we want assurance that we are purchased from the power of sin and Satan?" The Bible tells speaks of "the church of God which He hath purchased with His own blood" (Acts 20:20). Do you need certainty of your redemption? Scripture says, "Ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold...but with the precious blood of Christ as of a Lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Peter 1:18-19). Do you want to be sure of access to the throne of God? God's Word says. "Having boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus...let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith..." (Hebrews 10:19 – 22). Do you need assurance that you will in fact enter into heaven? Scripture says, "...And he said to me, these are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore are they before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple: and he that sitteth on the throne shall dwell among them. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sun light on them, nor any heat. For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters: and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes" (Revelation 7:14-17).

Without the cross of Christ there is no salvation, for "without shedding of blood is no remission of sins" (Hebrews 9:22). Lent is about Christ and what He has done for us to cleanse and prepare us for heaven.

We make no apology for saying that among us that is the concentration of our midweek Lenten services. We earnestly invite you and encourage you to sit at the altar of the cross faithfully with your family this Lenten season. From it the cleansing blood of Christ flows to the salvation of all who believe in Him. Bring your family. Invite a friend.

"The preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18).
