"YOU CAN INVITE THE SPIRIT INTO YOUR HEART" is a message that hangs on a fence in our city (Corpus Christi, TX). Just how does one do this? Can an unbeliever ask the Spirit to come into his heart? If it were possible, just how would the Spirit enter into the heart? Does He float down from the heavens like the falling leaves? The fact is that is that such a suggestion is part of the emotionalism that for many passes for Christianity in our day.

First of all, "Who is the Spirit?" The Spirit of God is the third person of the Trinity, coequal with the Father and with the Son, Who with "the glory equal, the majesty coeternal" composes the Godhead (Athanasian Creed). Divine names, divine power, and divine attributes (characteristics) are ascribed to the Holy Ghost. Indeed without the work of the Holy Ghost within the heart, no one can say that Jesus is Lord (1 Corinthians 12:3).

Of our call to faith, Scripture says, "... but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God" (1 Corinthians 6:11). To do this the Spirit employs the Gospel in Word and Sacrament – the Means of Grace. The question is asked in Romans 10:14 where we read - and this speaks specifically to our subject- "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed...? They can't! "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Romans 10:17). In James we read, "Of His own will begat He us with the word of truth...(1:18).

All by nature are dead in trespasses and sins. The dead cannot invite the Spirit into the heart! The Spirit calls through the Word. So then, He does not come through wishful thinking. He does not come through an appeal of emotion. He does not come through a frenzied golden-toned orator!

Through the Gospel the Spirit works saving faith so that the Christ believer rejoices in the love of God, the remission of sins, and in the salvation of his soul. Through faith in Christ we are children of God, and the Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God.

To His disciples, Jesus promised the Holy Ghost, the Spirit of truth who would guide them into all truth. Now as disciples we implore the Holy Spirit to give us wisdom, increase our faith, strengthen us in our hope, and keep us unto salvation. Now we pray the Spirit of God to sanctify us by the truth, God's Word (John 17:17). All that the Spirit did and does is connected with the Word of God! Further Christ believers pray that the Spirit sanctify our will and desires so that our whole conduct and life may serve to the glory of God. "This is the will of God, even your sanctification" (1 Thessalonians 4:3). God's will for us is brought to pass through the Spirit of God for "We are <u>His workmanship</u>, created in Christ Jesus unto good works which God has before ordained that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10).

All this is without merit or worthiness on our part! It is by grace alone.

As unregenerate, we did not invite the Spirit into our heart. He overcame our heart by the Gospel. Now as a fruit of the Spirit Christ believers desire to stand in truth, trusting in Christ, bringing forth the fruits of repentance, and manifesting the will of God in our lives. As children of God we will resist grieving the <a href="Spirit" by whom you [we] were sealed for the day of redemption" (Ephesians 4:30). We pray the Holy Spirit to sanctify us body and soul until the day of the Lord's appearing. Our prayer daily is, "Create in me a clean heart, O God...and take not Thy Holy Spirit from me" (Psalm 51: 10, 11). (Written by Rev. Daniel Fleischer 6/5/2005)

Nails in my hands might produce birdhouse. Nails in Jesus Christ's hands produced redemption for the entire world.






