Sermon: Hebrews 12:1-13 (1) Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, (2) looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (3) For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls. (4) You have not yet resisted to bloodshed, striving against sin. (5) And you have forgotten the exhortation which speaks to you as to sons: "My son, do not despise the chastening of the LORD, Nor be discouraged when you are rebuked by Him; (6) For whom the LORD loves He chastens, And scourges every son whom He receives." (7) If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? (8) But if you are without chastening, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate and not sons. (9) Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? (10) For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. (11) Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it. (12) Therefore strengthen the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees, (13) and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be *dislocated*, but rather be healed." (NKJVTM)

WE DO NOT WALK ALONE!

At the risk of being accused of being a pessimist or a doom's day purveyor, we do not apologize for saying that this is a most miserable world in which we live. It is not the world the Lord created. It is not the world the Lord intended for mankind when by His creative act He placed Adam and Eve on the earth. It is a world into which the devil intruded, and in which Adam and Eve bought the lie. Ever since it is a world infected with sin and infested with sinners. "Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). Men can excuse it, accommodate themselves to it, and try to deny it. It is a world spiraling downward.

Yet in the midst of it the Lord in His grace preserves His elect children. Knowing that "here we have no continuing city, but we seek one to come" (Hebrews 13:14), we nevertheless must live here until the Lord takes us to the better home. As pilgrims in a strange place, we pray for the place we now call home. May God's Word work mightily to change hearts and attitudes! We pray further: "Grant health and prosperity to all that are in authority, especially to the President and Congress of the United States ... and endue them with grace to rule after Thy good pleasure, to the maintenance of righteousness, and to the hindrance and punishment of wickedness, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. May it please Thee also to turn the hearts of our enemies and adversaries, that they may cease their enmity and be inclined to walk with us in meekness and in peace. All who are in trouble, want, sickness, anguish of labor, peril of death, or any other adversity, especially those who are suffering for Thy name's sake, comfort, O God, with Thy Holy Spirit ... O most merciful Father, remember not the sins of our youth nor our many transgressions, but out of Thy unspeakable goodness, grace, and mercy defend us from all harm and danger of body and soul. Preserve us from false and pernicious doctrine, from war and bloodshed from all calamity by fire

and water, from hail and tempest, from failure of harvest and from famine, from anguish of heart and despair of Thy mercy and from an evil death ... Give success to the Christian training of the young, and to all lawful occupations on land and sea, and to all pure arts and useful knowledge; and crown them with Thy blessing."

Redeemed children, who by the Spirit of God trust in Jesus, are able to enjoy life even in this dying world. On the pastor's cluttered bulletin board is a picture the caption of which is, "We do not walk alone." When all things seem against us we have the Father's promise, "Fear not; I have called thee by thy name; thou art Mine" (Isaiah 43:1). "Fear not, nor be afraid of them, for the Lord Thy God, He it is that doth go with Thee; He will not fail thee, nor forsake thee" (Deuteronomy 31:6). "For the Lord will not forsake His people" (1 Samuel 12:22). God's Word and promise builds the confidence of faith so that we with knowledge and confidence might say, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff, they comfort me" (Psalm 23:4). They who are without Christ have no such hope!

God's people are not pessimists but we are realistic. Hope, like the dawning of a new day is always new. We pray for and hope for a better day in the home we now inhabit. But we live and are confident that better awaits! Our Lord says," Behold <u>I am with you and will keep you</u> <u>wherever you go</u>, and will bring you back to this land; I will not leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you" (Genesis 28:15).
