## **Celebrations This Week**

What's the Connection — Three celebrations share the same two days but have very little in common. Halloween, Reformation, and All Saints' Day occupy the Oct. 31st and Nov. 1st on our modern calendars but that is really the extent of what they have in common. There is a connection that doesn't get too much attention in our money driven society that spends more to celebrate Halloween than every other holiday other than Christmas. What follows is a brief history of the connection that ties these three celebrations to the same dates on our calendar.

The Celtic people who lived in England, Ireland, and Northern France over 2,000 years ago are usually credited with starting the holiday that is commonly referred to as Halloween today. The Celts considered

November 1st to be the start of their new year. On New Year's Eve (Oct. 31st) they honored the Celtic false god of death named Samhain with plant, animal, and according to some accounts, even human sacrifices burned on great bonfires.

The Celts believed that Samhain freed the souls of the dead for this one night so they could visit their earthly homes. Costumed merrymakers often played mischievous tricks on their enemies and then blamed the so-called visiting souls for their misdeeds. That is how the pranks and ghosts entered the picture.



At some point in history, church leaders decided it would be good to replace this pagan holiday with a Christian holiday. So they moved a major festival (All Saints' Day) of the Pentecost season in the Spring of the year to November 1st in an attempt to provide a Christian alternative to the pagan celebration. The festival of All Saints' Day honored and remembered all faithful Christians who had died as martyrs for their faith. October 31st became the known as "All Hallows' Eve" or "Hallow-een." The Celtic people celebrated the church holiday, while mixing it with their old pagan customs.

During the Middle Ages, satanic cults, such as the Druids, made Halloween their most festival and mocked the church's holy day by taunting and playing mischievous tricks on those who opposed them. It was during these years that satanic elements of witches, wizards, devils, and superstition became the prevalent symbols of Halloween.

Finally, there is the Reformation connection. It was on October 31st, 1517 that Martin Luther nailed his 95 talking points of the Reformation to the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Since All Saints' Day was a very well attended celebration of the church in Luther's day, he knew that his 95 Thesis would be seen by many on that particular day. It seems that Luther may have chosen this day for no other reason than good advertising sense.

The adversaries understand priesthood not of the ministry of the Word, and administering the Sacraments to others, but they understand it as referring to sacrifice; as though in the New Testament there ought to be a priesthood like the Levitical, to sacrifice for the people, and merit the remission of sins for others. We teach that the sacrifice of Christ dying on the cross has been sufficient for the sins of the whole world, and that there is no need, besides, of other sacrifices, as though this were not sufficient for our sins. Men, accordingly, are justified not because of any other sacrifices, but because of this one sacrifice of Christ, if they believe that they have been redeemed by this sacrifice. They are accordingly called priests, not in order to make any sacrifices for the people as in the Law, so that by these they may merit remission of sins for the people; but they are called to teach the Gospel and administer the Sacraments to the people. Nor do we have another priesthood like the Levitical, as the Epistle to the Hebrews sufficiently teaches. ...
