WHY CONTEND FOR THE TRUTH?

Contending for the Truth is a challenge. It is done with certain risks. As the Christ-believers contend uncompromisingly for God's Word in our society, they run the risk of alienating family and friends. People in the office may ostracize them. Even within the church some may view them as troublemakers or "Bible thumpers." Some see them as loveless and arrogant. They will be described by an increasing number as people living in the past, and intellectually deprived since they still believe the words of the Bible written so many centuries ago and outdated for our so called "enlightened" generation.

Why in the face of it are there still Christ-believers who will contend for the truth of God's Word in a post- Christian culture? There are still some because the Spirit of God has overcome in their heart the natural objection of the flesh. They stand in awe of the Lord God Who has created them, redeemed them and sanctified them. They are of a contrite heart and tremble at the Word of God (Isaiah 66:2). They know that they are sinners deserving of eternal death. They know that without Christ there is no peace of heart or hope of heaven. They know that without the Gospel, the love of Christ remains a hidden mystery. They know further that it is the Lord's will that they stand apart from false teaching and false teachers (Romans 16:17,18). They know that the devil and his minions are seeking to destroy the faith once delivered unto the saints (Jude 3). They know that if the source of faith, the Word, be polluted the confident faith in Christ unto salvation is undermined if not lost.

God help us so that "they" is we!

There is a very personal reason why Christ-believers will contend for the truth of God's Word and bear the stings and arrows of the world and false brethren. It has to do with assurance, eternal assurance. When people, even deniers and compromisers, are confronted with uncertainty, sickness, and death they frequently turn to the Word of God. Why even do they turn to the Word if it is outdated? And to which Word do they turn if they are not sure what is the Word of God and what is not? And if they are sure that to what they have turned is the Word of God how do they know if what is God's Word to them is only a subjective opinion? How do they know that the comfort they seek is for them, or that it is reliable? How do they who have played loose with the Word of God know that God cares when the pressure of affliction and even death begins to tighten around them?

God help us, lest we become "they!"

Why contend for the Truth? The answer is simple. Our confident hope of heaven is established upon the Truth! On the basis of the truth of God's Word we are confident of our salvation in Jesus Christ Who is the "Word made flesh" and "the Way, the Truth and the Life." It is the Holy Scriptures in which God clearly reveals Himself and shows forth the depth of His love in Jesus, our Savior. On the basis of the Word, Paul writing to Timothy from prison said, "For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day. Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 1:12-13).

Such confidence can only be born of the Word of God, the Word of Truth. For it we will contend in our age. Great is the risk, but greater the loss if failing to contend we lose the truth, and with it the assurance of eternal life itself that has as its only source God's Truth. (Written by Rev.
