CHRIST mas TIME:

We submit that for a great part of our society Christmas is nothing more than an excuse to celebrate man's self absorption and greed. The weekend following Thanksgiving kicks off Christmas shopping in earnest. We are told that the economics of the Christmas season are determined to a great extent by the number of shoppers as well as the amount of money spent on that weekend. We have the obligatory news reports ad nauseum from malls and stores around town interviewing shoppers and store managers about what, how much, and who is buying. Stores open at early morning hours, if not midnight, so that people who have been standing in line for hours in rain, snow, and cold can be the first ones into the store to spend their money which otherwise they seem not to have.

From where we sit we look on with amazement at the gullibility and emptiness of people whose Christmas is consumed by the pursuit of stuff. We look on with a sense of sorrow that we don't have people lining up with chairs, cots, tents, and blankets hours in advance so that they can rush the church door as soon as it opens during the Christmas season, or on Sunday. Shall we conclude that we must not be marketing the church correctly, because surely people would want to hear the Gospel? Hearing the Gospel would seem to be attractive, for, after all, the church does not charge to hear the Gospel- but then today, who knows? We might even suggest that the church offers a comfortable place to sit for an hour while it dispenses its message free of charge. And surely the gift it gives through the Gospel – assuming that the Gospel is till preached, this too is not guaranteed – is the message of forgiveness and eternal life through the Savior, Jesus Christ. Why are people not lined up outside the church door?

The answer? The "natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them for they are spiritually discerned" (1 Corinthians 2:14). By nature, man is concerned with the things of this world. His focus is earthly and material. Natural man is a religious being, which is not the same as a spiritual being. He cannot know the things of the Spirit of God except through the Word.

Natural man denies anything higher than himself, and if by

chance he acknowledges a higher being than himself, he wants to be the creator of whatever it is that is higher than he. Natural man is therefore an idolater. Sin and guilt are foreign to natural man. Secure in himself and without knowledge of sin and its consequence, he tries to address the evil in the world by addressing the symptoms. Natural man lives in a state of denial concerning sin. The regenerate person on the other hand, still in the flesh, recognizes the reality of sin, confesses his sin, and believes that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.

They who are of the Spirit of God are they who have been convicted by the law of God and who despairing of self have been renewed unto a new hope in Christ through the Gospel. Their Christmas obsession is not the shopping mall, but the manger bed wherein lies the Savior!

They enjoy the blessings and opportunities which God showers upon them while on the earth, but their focus is different. Their focus is



heaven. They look forward to eternal life, to the everlasting inheritance received in all its fullness when they have put off the mortal body. To grow in faith and in confidence of salvation they love to hear the Word of the Gospel.

The challenge of the Church is to proclaim faithfully the Word of God- both law and gospel. No, we do not ever expect people to storm the doors of the church to hear the Word. But we can pray that when "sinners see their lost condition, and feel the pressing load of sin ..." (TLH 65), they will be open to the gospel, and will be moved to understand that their future lies not in mad pursuit of substance that moth and rust corrupt, but in the eternal Son of God born in the flesh in Bethlehem. Blessed are all who understand that focus of this season is not about stuff, but the manger and the cross. It is about God giving His Son, the Redeemer and Savior. It is CHRISTmas time!
