LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES:

Note: The pastor will light the Christ candle (the white candle in the middle of the Advent wreath). Once the Christ candle is lit, the congregation is invited to come forward and light a candle from the Christ candle. Your candle will be presented to you by the usher. You may light your candle by tipping it to another lighted candle, but please do not tip a lighted candle. We ask that only children ages 5 and older hold their own candles.



SIXTH READING: Luke 2:1-11 Christ, as the Light of the world, is born.

Note: After singing the first stanza of Silent Night, please sing "oo" for two stanzas during the reading. Afterward the congregation may then again join in singing stanza 3:

1. Silent night! Holy night! All is calm, all is bright, Round yon Virgin Mother and Child. Holy Infant, so tender and mild, Sleep in heavenly peace, Sleep in heavenly peace.
