Children's Recitation:..... Mark 16:1-8: The Resurrection Account

Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary *the mother* of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first *day* of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away; for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples; and Peter; that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you." So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

† NO EASTER? †

The age in which we live is bent on eradicating any reference to anything Christian. Even Christian holy-days (holidays) are renamed. We are no longer to mention "Christmas" but are told to use some generic expression in its place. Recently we heard that "Easter" is also coming under attack. Some school out east no longer speaks of the Easter bunny, but the "garden bunny." Easter vacation is no longer that, but "spring break." And of course an Easter egg hunt is too suggestive so now it is simply an "egg hunt." As people who do not buy into the political correctness, we ought continue to speak as we always have!

But we are just as amused if not troubled at the emotion that arises in people who are upset at the loss of the "Easter bunny," the "Easter egg," and "Easter vacation." What do any of these have to do with the meaning of Easter anyway? Will we somehow have lost the meaning of the message we hear at Easter? Do we no longer have Easter because rabbits, eggs, and vacations are no longer prefaced with the word, "Easter?"



The festival of Easter "is celebrated soon after the spring equinox, when in the world of nature daytime has caught up with and already even overtaken night time: the sun has won the victory. Darkness and cold have been overtaken by light and warmth."

The light of nature is but a shadow of the real light and warmth in which the Christian is confirmed at Easter. The dank, cold grave has lost its sting. The darkness of condemnation and judgment has been overcome. The grip of sin and death has been broken for "Christ, the Lord is Risen today!" Easter and the Easter season is the church's great season of joy because the Lord Who was "crucified, dead and buried," has risen from the dead to live forever. His resurrection from the dead is the Father's confirmation of our forgiveness, our redemption, and our salvation. Its message of the restoration of life and hope of heaven leads us to say, "But chiefly we are bound to praise Thee for the glorious resurrection of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord; for He is the very Paschal (Passover) Lamb which was offered for us and hath taken away the sins of the world; Who by His death hath destroyed death and by His rising to life again has restored to us everlasting life."

The world can take away the Easter bunny, the Easter egg, the Easter vacation if it makes them feel good. They can mock Easter. Such callousness toward Easter and its message only betrays an ignorance of what gives Easter its meaning. They can take away all references to "Easter" but they cannot change history, or destroy the joy of Christ believers. As Luther said in another context, "Let these all be gone, they yet have nothing won," for nothing can erase the reality of God's love spoken in the angel's message, "He is not here; for He is risen as He said ..." (Matthew 28; 6). Our whole life and hope and joy are predicated on the resurrection of the Lord Jesus from the dead. Paul gives it all meaning for those who believe in the risen Lord Jesus:

"Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1Corinthians 15:51-57).

Call Easter what they will, deny it if they will, "Christ the Lord is risen today." Consequently when this world is passed away they who are alive in Christ will join the saints before the throne of God in heaven. "Amen, Amen, that is Yea. Yea. so shall it be!" Easter? Yes! A blessed Easter to all in the risen Lord Jesus!



Sermon: *Luke 24:13-35*

(13) Now behold, two of them were traveling that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was seven miles from Jerusalem. (14) And they talked together of all these things which had happened.
