

I AM SORRY ... IF:

In this interminably long political campaign, emotions have run high, tempers have flared, and political discourse has plummeted frequently into a black hole. This is nothing new in this political season or for that matter in society generally. Except that issues that must be addressed are serious, this political season has afforded some comic relief through the accusations that have been made and the comments that are offered as an apology. In the course of it all what has been exposed is an all too pervasive attitude of the sin-corrupted heart that is part of the fallen nature of us all.

"Sin" – the transgression of God's law - is a small word with consequences. "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23). Impenitence, the unwillingness to acknowledge and confess sin before God, carries with it the curse of eternal death. Of course, the subject of sin, confession, and its consequence is of little interest to those who reject God's Word (the Law), and have only disdain for God (the Lawgiver). They cannot appreciate God's Word (the Gospel), or God's Son, Jesus Christ (the Savior from sin). They come to everlasting condemnation.

Scripture tells us, "He that covers his sins shall not prosper ..." (Proverbs 28: 13). This is of course of no concern to those who deny the reality of sin. The verse goes on, "But whoso confesses and forsakes them shall have mercy." This is meaningless to those who will not confess. We read also, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we



have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us" (1 John 1: 8 - 10).

So what is confession? Confession involves the acknowledgement of sin. Confession in its entirety includes "that we receive absolution or forgiveness …" (Luther's *Small Catechism*). Furthermore as we confess our sins to the Lord in the confidence of forgiveness through our Lord Jesus Christ, the Christ believer will accede to the Word which declares, "Confess your faults one to another, and pray for one another …" (James 5: 16). Particularly we will confess those sins to one another that burden the conscience. We will do this to make things right with the neighbor against whom we have sinned, but above all that we might be relieved in our conscience through the blessed message of forgiveness in our Lord Who died to take away our sin, and Whose blood has washed us clean.

He who honestly confesses his sin does not try to justify it, excuse it, or spin it. True confession comes clean before God. Israel did not find relief until it said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against thee" (Number 21: 7). David, to his own discomfort (Psalm 32), tried to cover his sin. When confronted by Nathan, the prophet of the Lord, David confessed it. In the 51st Psalm he said, "For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me. Against Thee, Thee only have I sinned, and done this evil in Thy sight …" (vv. 3, 4). Upon his confession, David found comfort in that "Thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin" (Psalm 32:5).

Confession and apology are not the same thing. Confession involves acknowledgement of sin. Apology is the expression of remorse at some misdeed or wrongdoing. Confession includes faith in the forgiveness of sin. Apology or remorse frequently is nothing more than that. As Christ believers are to live honestly before all, we will honestly acknowledge our sin and/or wrongdoing against our neighbor when we have wronged him. Our sorrow will manifest itself through seeking to make amends if possible.

This brings us back to our political reference. More than once things have been said for which someone felt it politically expedient to apologize. But what of these apologies? What kind of apology is it whether out of the mouth of a politician or our own mouth one says, "If I offended anyone ... if I hurt anyone's feelings ... if I upset anyone ... if I used an expression that troubles you, I apologize." That is neither an apology nor a confession. Such a manner of speech basically says, "I said what I said and I meant what I said, but I am sorry you are offended." Such an apology is not only not an acknowledgment of a wrong, but is rather a veiled suggestion that

the real sin is not that of the perpetrator of the word or deed, but of the one who was offended. The offended one should not have been so sensitive. His being offended becomes the sin.

Imagine Israel saying to Moses and God, "If we hurt your feelings or if we offended you we are sorry …" Or David saying, "God, if I offended you, I am sorry." The prodigal son did *not* say in Luke 15, "I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, 'if I have

to one another,

offended you …" Instead he said, "I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, *I have sinned* against heaven, and before thee, and am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants … And the son said unto him, Father, <u>I have sinned against heaven</u>, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son" (Luke 15: 11 - 32).

Before God, the ultimate Judge of all, recognize that all your righteousnesses are as filthy rags (Isaiah 64:6). Examine your life in the mirror of God's law and say honestly, "Heavenly Father, I have sinned against you in thought, in word, and in deed. I am sorry for my sin against you. Forgive me for Jesus' sake." That is true sorrow and a meaningful confession. Then believe that for Jesus' sake the Heavenly Father has indeed put away your sin.

To live peaceably with all speak and live honestly; to find the peace which is God's will for you in Christ, make straightforward confession to Him Who says "Be of good cheer, Thy sins be forgiven thee." Our Father's word of grace and forgiveness in Christ is unconditional! Let our confession and sorrow be without evasion or dissembling.
