- ◆ CLC News: Pastor Michael Schierenbeck has resigned his call at Faith in Markensan, WI, due to his myeloproliferative disorder. In a letter to Faith he wrote: "The Lord says in Prov. 16:9: 'A man's heart plans his way, but the LORD directs his steps.' I have considered these words in the context of the past year of my life. Whatever plans I had needed to be adjusted in consideration of being diagnosed with an illness that would change my life and my ability to function as I had in the past .... This last week my doctor confirmed that the only option to eliminate the disease from my system is to undergo a stem cell transplant. This is a very difficult procedure and requires six months to a year or beyond to recover. ... My family will be settling in the Markesan community and I look forward to serving the Lord and this congregation as a lay member ...."

## THE CHURCH THAT LOST ITS WAY:

Pentecost reminds and confirms to us what the  $\underline{C}$ hurch is. At the preaching of the Word, the Spirit of God added to the body of the saved His elect members. We are reminded that the Church in the true sense of the word is the "called out ones," - all who have been called out of darkness of sin and unbelief to faith in Jesus Christ. The Church of which Christ is both the Head and the Foundation is the spiritual body of Christ. We are reminded how it is that the elect are gathered in to the body of Christ which we recognize in the Apostolic Creed as the Holy Christian Church. The apostle Peter enunciated the law of God- "you crucified" Him Who is both Lord and Christ. Peter spoke the gospel for the comfort of hearts that were pricked by the indictment against them. He spoke concerning the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ and responded to the plea of troubled hearts saying, "Repent and let everyone of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2) The Law does not convert nor does it create members of Christ's body. Nevertheless it is an essential and indispensable preaching for it crushes the hard heart and prepares the heart for the seed of the Gospel.

The Church is found wherever the Gospel of Christ is proclaimed. Gospel preaching bears fruit (Isaiah 55:10, 11). God will's that likeminded Christ believers join together (fellowship) around Word and sacrament. Thus is brought into existence visible congregations. But since not all Christians agree in the teachings of the Bible there are many visible denominations. Knowledgeable and discriminating Christ believers will want to associate with such a church as they are convinced teaches the Word of God in its truth, and which therefore fulfills the Savior's commission, "teaching them to observe all things, whatsoever I have commanded you ..." (Matthew 28:20). They desire to continue in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship (Acts 2). On the other hand, they understand that to sit at the feet of false teachers is contrary to God's Word and they further understand that "False teachings are always dangerous; they never nurse our spiritual life ..." (Luther's Small Catechism-Annotated: E. W. A. Koehler, page 152). Every false doctrine has the potential to destroy faith!

For this reason Martin Luther testified against the errors of the Catholic Church. His intent was not to leave it but to create a forum in which discussion of the Word would bring the church back to the Scriptures. We know the Reformation history and how this good intent met with failure. But he was conscience bound to set forth the Scriptures and continue his witness against the errors of the church, a course which he freely admitted was not an easy one. Consequently he was excommunicated. Ultimately the Lord Who raised him up for this task blessed his efforts, and a church known as "Lutheran" came into existence.

Out of the period of the Reformation, begun in 1517, Protestantism was born in 1529. Within Protestantism Lutherans were unique, in that they "declared their readiness to obey the emperor and the diet in 'all dutiful and possible matters,' not however, any order considered by them to be repugnant to God and His holy Word, to their soul's salvation, and to their good conscience. The essential principles involved in their agreement were, first, the authority of Scripture, to be explained by itself; secondly, freedom of conscience" (Lutheran Cyclopedia, CPH 1927, page 625).

Protestantism has many faces. Today sadly and to great harm of precious blood bought souls, Lutheranism also has many faces. Martin Luther consented to the use of his name for those who identified with him, so long as such use meant that the church continued steadfast in the Word! He himself said that he had "no desire to be Lutheran except insofar as he teaches the Holy Scripture in purity" (WLS, Vol. II, para.2679, page 858). We are bold and confident to say that Luther would for the most part not recognize the Lutheran Church today!

We recognize that as times change the church has to adapt itself to present realities in custom, tradition, etc. But we reject without apology the idea that the church must, should, or can adapt what it teaches to satisfy today's culture, morals, politics, and empty religiosity! As it adopts relativistic teaching in today's rootless age, it ceases to be faithful to the Word for under such circumstances it is no longer "teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I (the Lord) have commanded ..."

When God's Word and all it teaches ceases to be the message, then emotion, accommodation, and doctrines of men fill the vacuum. Teaching for doctrines the commandments of men becomes the functioning principle- whether out of fear of consequences for speaking the truth, or out of plain rejection of the truth!

The Holy Christian Church shall remain and be delivered. The gates of hell shall not prevail against it! To an alarming extent, however, the church on earth, including the Lutheran Church has lost its way! We must ask in all honesty and introspection: How long will the Church of the Lutheran Confession remain faithful to the whole of Scripture, and to the doctrine set forth by its forebear? If the question disturbs one, better that to think that at almost 50 years it can't happen to us!
