First Reading:

Isaiah 56:1, 6-8

God in His Word never spoke in exclusive terms about the offer of salvation. He wanted "all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth." Yet neither did He speak in permissive terms. We ought to be of the same mind - wanting all men to be saved, but never willing to compromise the Word of God in our own misguided effort to accomplish that noble goal.

Second Reading: *Romans 11:13-15, 29-32*

Jesus made it clear that He loved his own race, the Jews, but came to suffer and die for all men, for "God so loved <u>the world</u>..." Paul here imitates his Lord. Some mistakenly believe that Paul is here teaching that all will eventually go to heaven. The offer of heaven is open to all, but only through faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. In that way God has mercy on all.

- ★ A motion to create a cell phone allowance of \$50 per month starting September 1, 2008 for our principal was approved.


Board of Trustees Report

- ◆ Fay: The Lord has again been remarkably gracious toward us down here in Florida. We were particularly vulnerable. We are putting an addition on the teacherage. Saturday we stripped the roof and put on the tar paper. We were not able to get the inspection done before the storm hit. At first it looked like Hurricane/Tropical Storm Fay was coming right for Winter Haven. However, the eye moved about sixty miles to the east. As a result, we have been on the edge of the storm the whole time. It came in south of us going across the state from the west coast to the east coast. (No damage to North Port.) Then when it hit the Atlantic at Melbourne, it turned and came back over the north of us. If you look at a map, it is almost like the line the Lord put between the Egyptians and the land of Goshen. Seventy miles south of us, seventy miles east of us, and now seventy miles north of us there were winds of up to 60 mph and over 24 inches of rain. We got very little wind or rain. In fact, the shingles were put on yesterday and the house wrap, windows, and door were installed on the addition. Fay is like some other guests that come to Florida. She won't leave. It's moving a little faster (6mph) now which is good because it won't drop as much rain as when it was almost stationary. It still has winds of 50 mph. We are still getting the feeder bands which means light windy rain that comes and goes and makes a mess. The weather is really kind of pleasant here with all the breeze.
