

Confession & Absolution: Tune of "Hark! The Voice of Jesus Calling"

- P: We have come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve Him as His dear children. But we have disobeyed Him and deserve only His wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to Him and plead for His mercy.
- C: O most merciful God, who has given Your only-begotten Son to die for us, have mercy upon us and for His sake grant us remission of all our sins; and by Your Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of You and of Your will and true obedience to Your Word, to the end that by Your grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
- P: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us and has given His only Son to die for us and for His sake forgives us all our sins. To them that believe on His name He gives power to become the sons of God and has promised them His Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptized shall be saved. Grant this, Lord, to us all.

SING(I): Rise, Thou, Light of Gentile nations,

- P: We know where this world came from, for it is written:
- C: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."
- P: Even as a house stands as testimony to its builder, so the creation itself stands as a witness to God, for it is written:
- C: "Every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God."
- P: We can see from the Creation around us that God is Wise and Powerful, for it is also written:
- C: "For since the creation of the world God's invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse."
- P: God has also shown Himself to be kind and good in the way He supports and protects His Creation. For it is written:
- C: "Nevertheless He did not leave Himself without witness, in that he did good, gave us rain from heaven and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness."
- P: However, like footprints on the seashore, the Creation does not make known the Person of God nor does it give us His Name. It does not make known how sinful mankind may be saved. As it is written:

- C: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him."
- P: So much of mankind still today is in the dark.
- C: Not knowing who is the God of the Creation, the One True God.

SING(\$\mathcal{I}\$): Thou whose almighty word

Chaos and darkness heard And took their flight,

Hear us, we humbly pray, And where the Gospel day

Sheds not its glorious ray, Let there be light! (TLH 508:1)

- P: In time, the God of the Creation made Himself known to mankind by His Prophets and then through His Son, Jesus Christ. For it is written:
- C: "God, who at various times and in different ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son."
- P: In love, the God of the Creation left a more complete witness of Himself by directing men to put down His very words and thoughts in written form, as it is written:
- C: "... for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit."
- P: The God of Creation not only tells how He created the world, but even more importantly, how He redeemed the world through His Son.
- C: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."
- P: So God enlightens men today by His Word, so that they may know Him and the Savior Jesus Christ. So it is written:
- C: "... this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent."

- P: Now in moving us to trust in Christ by His Holy Spirit, God has made us and all Christians His witnesses and spokespeople to the world, as it is written:
- C: "... we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God."
- P: How can we hope to be successful? We are only sinful human beings and are powerless ourselves!
- C: Indeed, we must always remember that the power is of God and not of us.
- P: Truly, God's Word is still as powerful and effective as it was in time past. Through it others will be born again, given spiritual life through faith in Christ.

We will then visit the churches under Pastor Jeremiah Issanga, and conduct pastoral training in Arusha. We will travel to St. Peter's Lutheran Seminary in Himo, Tanzania, and celebrate with the people of the LCEA as St. Peter's has its first graduation. Eight men will be entering the pastoral ministry. The Mission Board recognizes a pressing need for a full-time missionary from the U.S. in East Africa. We pray that the Lord will enable us to send such a man when the resources are available.
