First Reading: Genesis 1:1-2,26-2:3

Of all creation, mankind was the pinnacle. He was made in the very image of God, holy and without sin. The very world in which Adam and Eve lived was perfect. It was not until their fall into sin that the Gospel would be necessary. Now we have an entire world of sinful humans to enlighten with the Gospel message of a Savior from sin.

**Sermon:** 2 Peter 3:3-10

(3) Know this first: that scoffers will come in the last days, walking according to their own lusts, (4) and saying, "Where is the promise of His coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of creation." (5) For this they willfully forget: that by the word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of water and in the water, (6) by which the world *that* then existed perished, being flooded with water. (7) But the heavens and the earth *which* are now preserved by the same word, are reserved for fire until the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men. (8) But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand vears, and a thousand years as one day. (9) The Lord is not slack concerning *His* promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. (10) But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up. ### Illustrations of the Foundational Nature of Divine Creation

#### 1) Divine creation is a foundation for the doctrine of <u>Law</u>.

Romans 2:14-15: for when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do the things in the law, these, although not having the law, are a law to themselves, who show the work of the law written in their hearts, ...

## 2) Divine creation is a foundation for all that the Bible teaches us about <u>death</u>.

1 Corinthians 15:22: For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

# 3) <u>Righteousness</u> and <u>salvation</u> on the earth are a result of God's creative activity.

Isaiah 45:8: Rain down, you heavens, from above, And let the skies pour down righteousness; Let the earth open, let them bring forth salvation, And let righteousness spring up together. I, the LORD, have created it.

4) The <u>Holy Christian Church</u> and our own faith in Christ are the result of God's creative activity through the Gospel.

Isaiah 43:1: But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine."

#### 5) Even our <u>good works</u> are the result of God's creative activity.

Ephesians 2:10: For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

## 6) All that the Bible teaches about <u>marriage</u> and <u>sex</u> is based on the fact of divine creation.


Genesis 2:22-24: Then the rib which the LORD God had taken from man He made into a woman, and He brought her to the man. And Adam said: "This is now bone of my bones And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man." Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.

#### 7) Divine creation reveals the evil nature of <u>murder</u> and <u>abortion</u>.

Genesis 9:6: Whoever sheds man's blood, By man his blood shall be shed; For in the image of God He made man.

# 8) The clear proclamation of divine creation is vital in doing <u>mission work</u> in our day.

Acts 14:15-17: [Where Paul is preaching to Gentiles who were not aware of the doctrine of creation] "Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men with the same nature as you, and preach to you that you should turn from these useless things to the living God, who made the heaven, the earth, the sea, and all things that are in them, who in bygone generations allowed all nations to walk in their own ways. Nevertheless He did not leave Himself without witness, in that He did good, gave us rain from heaven and fruitful seasons, filling our hearts with food and gladness."



#### Our Lutheran Position from Scripture <u>From the Brief Statement of 1932</u>

We teach that God has created heaven and earth, and that in the manner and in the space of time recorded in the Holy Scriptures, especially in Genesis 1 and 2, namely, by His almighty creative word, and in six days. We reject every doctrine which denies or limits the work of creation as taught in Scripture. In our days it is denied or limited by those who assert, ostensibly in deference to science, that the world came into existence through the process of evolution; that is, that it has, in immense periods of time, developed more or less out of itself. Since no man was present when it pleased God to create the world, we must look for a reliable account of creation to God's own record, found in God's own book, the Bible. We accept God's own record with full confidence and confess with Luther's Catechism: "I believe that God has made me and all creatures."

For in six days the LORD made the beavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and ballowed it. Exodus 20:11 For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God. Hebrews 3:4 By the word of the LORD the beavens were made, And all the bost of them by the breath of His mouth. Psalm 33:6
