JOY IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD: What is the best part of your day, or of your week? The answer of course will depend on what an individual thinks is important. For many of us days and weeks are very busy with legitimate pursuits. For others of us whose shadows are lengthening, the day and week is frequently consumed by contemplating how it used to be. In the former case joy is to a certain extent dictated by the success we have enjoyed in our pursuits. For the latter the joy frequently comes in memories and unexpected events as the day unfolds. But when all is said and done all that which brought joy in our lives comes to an end. We die and there is no joy in death.

To that extent our life is no different than that of the people of the earth through the ages. Frequently as one "mall-sits" and observes people, some rushing here and there, others resting on the bench simply putting in time until the day ends one wonders what lies behind the quick step and smiling face of the busy shopper, or within the heart of the weary bench-sitter.

One wonders. Is the busyness of the majority or the weariness of others indicative of something? Are some so busy that they have no time for the Lord God, if indeed they even know Him. Is the busyness they exhibit merely a mask for the insecurity they feel? Is their heart consumed with "getting", but void of meaning and hope? What about the weary and worn? Are they drowning in self-pity at the way it used to be when they were able to spend their time in chasing their dreams? We do not know, but this we do know. How dark and void the heart if Christ is not welcome and does not dwell in one's heart!

People die and there is no joy in death? Is that really so? Where Christ is not all in all it is so, but for the Christ believer who knows and believes that he is known of God having been redeemed by the blood of the Lord Jesus the sorrows we know and the loneliness we feel is supplanted by joy in remembering that the Lord Jesus Christ has not forgotten us. Even death itself cannot separate from God the trusting heart. There is sorrow of separation in the heart of those whom we leave behind in death, but there is joy for those who have departed in the Lord. The child of God can say, "Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness; To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, and not be silent. O LORD my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever" (Psalm 30: II- 12). There is joy in the presence of God for those who have died in the Lord. I wonder, and I wonder, how many of the busy shoppers and the weary bench-sitters know that and believe that!

Occasionally I wonder the same about ourselves- not because we do not believe, but because we do not take time during the day to come into the presence of God in our devotion, or pause on the day of worship to come into the presence of God around the Word and sacrament? Do we permit our legitimate pursuits and frequently our material and temporal concerns deprive us of the joy of being in God's kingdom even now? Are we so consumed by the past that we cannot appreciate the fact that our God is still with us, and has laid up for us an eternal inheritance? If our hearts are not filled with joy even in the midst of present sorrows might it be because we have trampled Him under foot in our daily pursuits or because we have placed the Lord on the back bench of our heart or have let Him in only at our convenience?

You are happy and joyful you say? Good! But only that joy is real that is rooted in the love of God who daily invites us to come into His presence now and hereafter.
